

CITY OF CROSSLAKE
COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS
PUBLIC HEARING AND REGULAR SESSION
JANUARY 8, 1990

The City Council for the City of Crosslake met in a Public Hearing and Regular Council Session on Monday, January 8, 1990 in the Council Chambers of City Hall. The following Councilmembers were present: Mayor Kurt E. Anderson, Lyle M. Arends, Roger A. Burslem, Diana A. Gallaway and Charles O. Miller. Also present were City Engineer Will Hoyt, City Clerk Arlene Buchite and approximately 14 citizens.

Mayor Anderson called this Public Hearing to order at 7:30 p.m. stating that the first item on the agenda was the floodplain ordinance revisions but since a new floodplain map outlining the area had not been received there would not be any action taken on this item. Mayor Anderson asked for any comments or suggestions. Mayor Anderson said he wanted to make sure that the floodplain ordinance, shoreland management standards and comprehensive plan were all adopted before any changes were made in the zoning ordinances. Mayor Anderson said he saw no changes in the proposed floodplain ordinance which adversely affects the City of Crosslake.

Councilmember Gallaway said it was suggested that Ron Morreim, Area Hydrologist, be contacted regarding the model floodplain ordinance. Mayor Anderson said he would contact Mr. Morreim before the next public hearing to see if he has any concerns regarding the City.

MOTION NO 1PH-01-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO ADJOURN THIS PUBLIC HEARING AT 7:34 P.M. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Mayor Anderson then called the regular session to order.

MOTION NO. 1R-01-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS TO APPROVE ALL ITEMS ON THE CONSENT CALENDAR CONSISTING OF: (1) MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 11, 1989 REGULAR COUNCIL SESSION; (2) MINUTES OF THE DECEMBER 19, 1989 SPECIAL COUNCIL SESSION; (3) THE CLERK/TREASURER'S FINANCIAL REPORT FOR DECEMBER, 1989; (4) THE TELEPHONE COMPANY'S FINANCIAL REPORT FOR DECEMBER, 1989; (5) THE CABLEVISION'S FINANCIAL REPORT FOR DECEMBER, 1989; AND (6) RENEWAL OF CIGARETTE LICENSES FOR 1990. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

CLERK'S REPORT - First item was bills for payment. MOTION NO. 1R-02-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY TO PAY ALL BILLS INCLUDING: (1) AMERICAN NATIONAL BANK FOR GOVERNMENT OBLIGATION BONDS FOR \$82,068.75; (2) CROSSLAKE BOTTLE GAS FOR WALL HANGING FURNACES AT THE FIRE HALL FOR \$3,002.00 AFTER ALL WORK IS COMPLETED; (3) RODE, LUCAS, SCHELLHAS AND GAMMELLO, CITY ATTORNEY FOR \$1,011.00; AND (4) LANDECKER AND ASSOCIATES FOR ASSESSMENT ROLL PREPARATION AND NOTICES FOR THE 1989 ROAD PROJECTS FOR \$1,980.00. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Clerk Buchite indicated she had received a letter, which needed to be signed, from Larson, Allen, Weishair and Company authorizing them to do the City audit. Clerk Buchite stated that Larson, Allen, Weishair and Company expected the audit to cost approximately \$4,900.00. Councilmember Bursham said he still feels the City should be able to tell them that we want the audit back sooner because we are paying them a lot of money to do it. Councilmember Gallaway said the decision was made to go with them this year and see when we get the audit back and if the Council feels it is not in a timely fashion then we will bid it next year. MOTION NO. 1R-03-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY TO ALLOW MAYOR ANDERSON TO SIGN THE LETTER AUTHORIZING LARSON, ALLEN, WEISHAIR AND COMPANY TO DO THE CITY AUDIT. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

The next item was a letter from Dahlgren, Shardlow and Uban offering assistance in planning requirements for the Shoreland Management and Floodplain Management rules and was copied to the Council for their information.

A letter from City Attorney James Gammello to Delorian Anderson of the Little Yukon greenhouses advising him of the decision of the Council to allow continued construction pursuant to the original permit was read by the Mayor and discussed briefly.

Three more letters had been given to the Council for their information. One was from the Planning and Zoning office in Brainerd requesting comments on their final draft of the Crow Wing County Comprehensive Water Plan. Another one was from the Minnesota Office of Waste Management regarding applications for grants and the third one was from a resident objecting to the assessments on Daggett Pine and also attached was the response to that letter from Will Hoyt.

The next item was a bill from Crosslake Lumber Company for the trusses which had been initially ordered for the John

Jones home before the roof pitch had been changed by mutual agreement between the Jones' and their neighbors. The Crosslake Lumber Company was requesting that the city pay the bill for the trusses. MOTION NO. 1R-04-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO NOT PAY FOR THE TRUSSES FROM CROSSLAKE LUMBER FOR THE JOHN JONES HOME. Mayor Anderson said Mr. Jones agreed to change the roof pitch. Councilmember Gallaway said she feels a letter should be written to the Lumber Company and enclose a copy of the minutes of the meeting where the pitch was changed. It was the consensus of the Council that the City was not liable for the trusses in any way. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

The next item was a request by the Mayor for a telephone credit card so he could make City calls from his home. Mayor Anderson said he polled the Council and now has the credit card.

Clerk Buchite indicated that Eugene Kennedy, Clerk for the Pequot Lakes Board of Education, had called and requested that the Board be allowed to use City Hall occasionally for Board of Education meetings. MOTION NO. 1R-05-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY TO APPROVE HAVING THE PEQUOT LAKES SCHOOL BOARD MEET AT CITY HALL WHEN THEY REQUEST TO. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

MAYOR'S REPORT - Mayor Anderson said he had received notice for a publication he would like to receive for building inspectors and zoning officers. Clerk Buchite indicated that Marlowe Kingstedt, Coordinator for Planning and Zoning currently receives this publication. Mayor Anderson said it may be a good idea for all of the Planning and Zoning Commission to have access to a copy to read. MOTION NO. 1R-06-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF THE ZONING BULLETIN FOR ONE YEAR AT \$48 IF THE COORDINATOR DOES NOT CURRENTLY RECEIVE IT. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Mayor Anderson gave Councilman Miller a copy of a road survey form which needed to be filled out and returned.

Mayor Anderson read a letter he had received from the Department of Natural Resources responding to the letter he sent regarding the new access on West Shore Drive. The Brainerd D. N. R. office was directed to look into the situation and get back to us.

Mayor Anderson proceeded to read his list of appointments for the year 1990. They are as follows:

Mayor Anderson said he would not name the Fire Chief until after the Firemen's meeting on Wednesday.

Mayor Anderson said he made out a list of every commission, when they meet and when each member's term expires and he wanted a copy of this attached to the minutes.

Mayor Anderson said he wanted the Council to approve these lists and expiration dates. Councilmember Gallaway stated that she did not think Vicky Leonard's term should be up as yet. Mayor Anderson said if he could not find any information on some members he picked dates so as not to have more than two replacements at a time.

Park Commission members listed and dates their terms expire are: JoAnn Jernal first term 1992; Andy Nelson first term 1991; Glenn Bennett first term 1993; Thomas Nelson first term 1993 and Vicky Leonard second term 1992. Liaison is Charles Miller. MOTION NO 1R-07-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS TO APPROVE THE PARK COMMISSION MEMBERS AND LIAISON AS PRESENTED BY THE MAYOR. COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS AND MILLER VOTED AYE AND COUNCILMEMBERS GALLAWAY AND BURSHAM VOTED

NAY. MOTION PASSED WITH MAYOR ANDERSON VOTING AYE. Ms. Gallaway said she voted nay because she does not believe that Ms. Leonards second term should be up in 1992. Mr. Bursheem said he does not feel that Mr. Arends should be replaced as liaison because he has done a good job.

Utilities Commission members listed and dates their terms expire are: Dene Carney second term 1991; Dale Dickey first term 1991; Richard Kendall second term 1992; Thomas Towne first term 1992; and Vivian Kittleson first term 1993. Liaison is Lyle Arends. MOTION NO. 1R-08-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS TO APPROVE THE UTILITIES COMMISSION MEMBERS AND LIAISON AS PRESENTED BY MAYOR ANDERSON. COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS AND MILLER VOTED AYE. COUNCILMEMBERS BURSHHEM AND GALLAWAY VOTED NAY. MOTION PASSED WITH MAYOR ANDERSON VOTING AYE.

Road Commission members were listed as: Jim Stevenson first term 1993; Jay Andolshek first term 1991; and Malcolm Perkins. Liaison is Charles Miller. Mayor Anderson said he is still making calls to fill vacancies but this is all for the road commission at present. MOTION NO 1R-09-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO APPROVE THE ROAD COMMISSION MEMBERS AND LIAISON AS PRESENTED BY MAYOR ANDERSON. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHHEM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Public Safety Commission members were listed as: Bob Weibke first term 1991; Joel Slack first term 1992; and Jack Lindenberg first term 1992. Mayor Anderson read a letter from Judy Cotten saying that she and Robert Baker were resigning. Liaison is Kurt Anderson. MOTION NO 1R-10-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER BURSHHEM TO APPROVE THE PUBLIC SAFETY COMMISSION MEMBERS AND LIAISON AS PRESENTED BY MAYOR ANDERSON. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHHEM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Planning and Zoning Commission members were listed as: Lyle Arends second term 1991; Jean-Paul Hudon first term 1991; Colleen Keim first term 1992; Armond Gease first term 1993; and Doug Nelson first term 1993. Liaison is Roger Bursheem. MOTION NO. 1R-11-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY TO APPROVE THE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION MEMBERS AND LIAISON AS PRESENTED BY MAYOR ANDERSON. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHHEM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Mayor Anderson said the two new members names for Planning and Zoning did not come from the Commission as they usually do but as a recommendation from him.

Funding and Future Development Commission members were listed as: Dean Swanson first term 1991; Bonnie Gries first term 1991; Tony Mayer first term 1992; Dorothy Allen first term 1992; William Reed first term 1993; Harlan Johnson first term 1993; and Louis Gottwalt first term 1993. Liaison is Diana Gallaway. MOTION NO. 1R-12-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER BURSHEM TO APPROVE THE FUNDING AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION MEMBERS AND LIAISON AS PRESENTED BY MAYOR ANDERSON. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHEM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

PARK COMMISSION - Acting Chairman Andy Nelson was present and said there was no Commission meeting in December because of the severely cold weather. Liaison Arends said the well in the warming house was causing some problems and something would have to be done with it. Councilmember Arends said it is pumping so slow that it takes five to six hours to flood the rink so the warming house attendants have had to work double shifts. Mayor Anderson suggested the Park personnel get some prices and estimates to determine what has to be done with the well.

Councilmember Miller said he has heard that a gentleman paid \$45 for a tennis tournament which he could not attend and was told he would receive his money back but has not as yet. Mayor Anderson said the tennis tournament was cancelled and a money order was sent to him because it was not City money on November 22. The money order had apparently gotten lost so Ms. Felber placed a stop payment on the first one and got a second one to send to him. Councilmember Miller said he will give him a call to see if he got it.

PLANNING AND ZONING - Liaison Burshem said he had nothing other than questions on grant money available for updating the City's comprehensive plan. Mr. Burshem was told it might be good to check into it. Mr. Kingstedt is on vacation so there was no coordinator's report.

CEMETERY - Mayor Anderson said he is in the process of sending out a new purchase agreement to Woog's to purchase a parcel of land to expand the Cemetery.

PUBLIC SAFETY - Mayor Anderson said the Commission had a meeting earlier in the day. Police Chief Backdahl had requested the meeting to seek input regarding the third full-time officer. Mayor Anderson said that the Public Safety Commission recommended to the Council to hire a third full-time officer. Police Chief Backdahl said police officers are now considered to be professionals because they are licensed by the State and therefore do not have to go through the process of advertising but can find a person

who is licensed and meets the requirements and hire them. Police Chief Backdahl said if the City goes through the advertising process, the application for a police officer is 42 pages long times the number of applicants seeking to fill the position so the City will be buried in paper. Chief Backdahl said his recommendation would be to form a panel, find two or three candidates to interview and make a recommendation to the Council. Councilmember Arends said he would like to see it advertised because otherwise people will say that the person is hand picked. Mayor Anderson said it would not be that way with a panel. Councilmember Gallaway said she feels the panel is the way to go. MOTION NO. 1R-13-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER BURSHEM AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO GO FORWARD WITH THE COMMITTEE PROCESS FOR RECRUITING A REPLACEMENT FOR SARGEANT DON COULTER AND ONCE WE HAVE THAT REPLACEMENT THEN WE SHOULD LOOK AT THE PROCESS OF HIRING A SECOND OFFICER. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHEM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Mayor Anderson said he would like to form the committee the same way as it was formed to hire the new maintenance person by taking two councilmembers, two commission members and the department head. Mayor Anderson named himself, Roger Burshem, Jack Lindenberg, Bob Weibke, Joel Slack and John Backdahl as the Committee members. MOTION NO. 1R-14-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO APPROVE THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS TO SIT ON THE PANEL, AS RECOMMENDED BY MAYOR ANDERSON, TO SELECT FINAL APPLICANTS FOR POLICE SARGEANT AND TO MAKE THEIR RECOMMENDATION TO THE COUNCIL FOR FINAL APPROVAL. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHEM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE. Chief Backdahl stated that it would be his recommendation to have both of these positions filled by April 1 because of the approaching summer. Mayor Anderson said he agreed that it was absolutely essential to have one new man hired by April 1. Mayor Anderson suggested that the Committee meet at the next regularly scheduled Public Safety meeting the first Monday in February.

Mayor Anderson said he wanted to have a meeting set up with the new owners of the Ambulance so the Council can get some answers to questions from some of the residents. Mayor Anderson said he would like to know why Crosslake seems to get stuck with all the costs. Mayor Anderson said that the meeting should be set up after the March Council meeting.

Mayor Anderson said the Fire Chief requested permission to purchase the two self-contained breathing apparatuses that were budgeted for 1990 and this was a recommendation from the Public Safety Commission. MOTION NO. 1R-15-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF TWO SELF-CONTAINED

BREATHING APPARATUSES AS BUDGETED FOR 1990 AND AS RECOMMENDED BY THE PUBLIC SAFETY COMMISSION. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Mayor Anderson said Chief Schliek requested permission to send the fire truck #1 to Madelia to have the rust removed from the tank at the cost of \$650, as a budgeted item, before the pump gets wrecked because of the rust. Councilmember Arends asked if the tank would be lined with anything and Chief Schliek said that it would have a sealer in it. MOTION NO 1R-16-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER BURSHAM TO APPROVE HAVING THE FIRE TRUCK #1'S RUSTY TANK REPAIRED AT A COST OF \$650 AS A BUDGETED ITEM. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Mayor Anderson said the next item requested by Chief Schliek was to add a heat shield and heater to the new fire truck to keep it from freezing. The cost is \$1,250 and it is an unbudgeted item. MOTION NO. 1R-17-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO APPROVE INSTALLING A HEAT SHIELD AND HEATER ON THE NEW FIRE TRUCK AT THE COST OF \$1,250.00 AND CHARGING IT TO THE CAPITOL OUTLAY ACCOUNT. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

Mayor Anderson said he had not received a price for the trusses or the new roof at the fire hall but TSP/ADG, the engineering firm whom the City was working with to see if the building was structurally sound, had indicated that it should not cost too much.

Councilmember Gallaway asked Chief Schliek if the letter had gone out that would help residents to lower their fire insurance. Chief Schliek said it should be done by June.

Councilmember Gallaway also asked if there had been anything done about a Right-to-know seminar. Clerk Buchite said she had talked to other cities and that none of them had any more information. She indicated she had talked to the State and they said they did not have anyone to teach the class anymore. Clerk Buchite indicated that this was something that should be done by the Police Department, Fire Department and Street Department because the City Clerk's office really had nothing to do with it. Clerk Buchite stated that the deadline was February 1, 1990. Councilmember Gallaway said it is really a Public Safety thing. Chief Backdahl said it could still be done by the first of February and that he would get with the Fire Chief and City Clerk to see what could be arranged. Chief Backdahl said the police department had a real serious situation with some dynamite this past year and that some of the items would just have to be generalized. Chief

Schliek said that an October 1, 1987 memo says that business owners must file a safety sheet listing hazards with the fire department but not all of them have done so.

UTILITIES COMMISSION - Mr. Dene Carney was present to say that the utilities company needed approval for the purchase of a new truck to replace the 1982 Ford truck which has 70,000 miles on it. Mr. Carney indicated they had sent invitations to bid to seven different dealers and received bids back from four of them. Mr. Carney said the Commission reviewed the bids and rather than take the trade in price they wanted to take the bid from Pine Motors and sell the used truck outright and that was the recommendation they were making to the Council. Mr. Carney said the Commission feels they can get approximately \$4,000 for the used truck and the trade-in price was only \$2,600. MOTION NO. 1R-18-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER BURSHAM TO APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATION FROM THE UTILITIES COMMISSION FOR THE PURCHASE OF A NEW TRUCK FOR \$15,536.00 FROM PINE MOTORS FOR THE UTILITIES COMPANY AND TO SELL THE OLD TRUCK OUTRIGHT. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.

ROAD COMMISSION - Liaison Miller said they did not have a meeting in December.

Pat Hoag, Road Supervisor, said they are using the material from the old City Hall to build a stall at the garage.

Will Hoyt, Landecker and Associates was present to answer any questions from the Council but none were asked.

FUNDING AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENT - Councilmember Bursham asked if anything had been done with the Nature Trails and Pat Hoag said they had not done anything yet because he has not seen a plan. Councilmember Gallaway said the main thing is to get in and widen the trail system. Mr. Hoag said he would get together with Harold Johnson to see what is needed.

PERSONNEL - The maintenance assistant's probation will be completed in February and he is doing very well according to Supervisor Hoag.

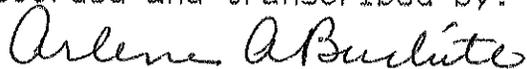
NEW BUSINESS - Councilmember Arends said an article in the Minnesota Association of Small Cities publication dealing with "Undesignated reserve funds could be tapped" bothered him. Councilmember Arends said he thinks all our funds should be designated. City Clerk Buchite will try to get more information on this.

OLD BUSINESS - Nothing.

PUBLIC FORUM - Libby Andolshek said she does not feel that Councilmember Arends should be on the Planning and Zoning Commission as a voting member. Mayor Anderson said he did some checking on this and found that according to our ordinance a city employee or councilmember can serve on a commission.

MOTION NO. 1R-19-90 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MILLER TO ADJOURN THIS REGULAR COUNCIL SESSION AT 9:16 P.M. MOTION PASSED WITH COUNCILMEMBERS ARENDS, BURSHAM, GALLAWAY AND MILLER VOTING AYE.
