The regular meeting of the Crosslake City Council was called to order by Mayor Whisler with Councilmen Arends, Benson, Andolshek, Delmonico, Clerk Fread and seventeen members of the community present.

The Mayor then asked for corrections, additions or changes to the February 12, 1979 minutes. He further stated his correction in paragraph three should read approximately \$74 in error rather than a \$1000 error. The Clerk agreed. Hearing no further changes, the minutes were approved with the exception of the above change.

On a motion by Andolshek and seconded by Arends, with all members voting "AYE", the Treasurer's report for February 28, 1979 was approved.

On a motion by Andolshek and seconded by Benson, with all members voting "AYE", the Crosslake Telephone Company's financial report for February 28, 1979 was approved.

On a motion by Arends and seconded by Andolshek, with all members voting "AYE", the request by the Crow Wing County Land Commission to change the classification for the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, T137N - R27W from conservation to non-conservation was approved.

Mr. Wendell Harms of the MinneCEP office then approached the Council with information on the following:

- A. The possible violation of the City of Crosslake's contract with CETA as it pertains to CETA employee Robin Julian, specifically "maintenance of effort". He further stated after his investigation he did not feel there was a violation, but he wanted to caution the Council of the potential.
- B. Mr. Harms went on to explain the primary purpose of CETA was to provide training so as an individual could find permanent gainful employment.
- C. After the question was raised by Delmonico, Mr. Harms further outlined the summer youth program for needy youths.

With no further questions, Mr. Harms then left the meeting.

Merrill Stodghill then asked if the Council could speak louder so the audience could hear better.

Reporting for the Telephone Commission, Andolshek indicated the commission had recommended rejecting the recent trencher bids. Arends so moved and Delmonico seconded, with all members voting "AYE", the bids were rejected.

Andolshek then moved the 1978 Crosslake Telephone Company audit report be approved. Benson seconded the motion, with all members voting "AYE", the audit was approved.

Andolshek then moved the Telephone Company be allowed to purchase a oscilloscope with digital V-O-M. Benson seconded, with all members voting "AYE", the purchase was approved.

The cemetery noted one burial for the month.

The Buildings Commission had no report.

Arends, reporting for the Road Commission, indicated they were having the snowplow repaired.

Delmonico asked Arends if there had been any activity as far as federal road grants. Arends indicated he had made some phone calls.

Delmonico asked if a letter had been sent to Pat Hoag per the last meeting. The Clerk indicated no.

Other discussion centered on the repair of Pine Island Bridge and the plowing of private driveways causing snow onto public roadways.

John Backdahl reported the resignation of Joe Doerfler as a police reservist and replacing him with Clarence "Bill" Jensen.

Also the police reserve brunch has been scheduled for May 22, 1979. The price will be \$1.95 for "all you can eat".

Reporting for the Park Commission, Delmonico displayed the new traffic control signs to be erected. He also reviewed the current activity schedule for the Community Center.

On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek, Crosslake Sanitation was to be engaged for garbage removal for the park facilities. Voting "AYE" were Arends, Whisler, Delmonico and Andolshek. Abstaining was Benson.

The Clerk was further instructed to purchase a Rayfo R-150 dumpster at a cost of \$190.

Delmonico questioned the fact if a letter had been sent to Mrs. Harold Burroughs per the last meeting. The Clerk had not completed this as yet.

Delmonico explained the controversy centered around the building permit issued to Robert Souther. Having found everything to be in order, he moved the Council approve the building permit. Andolshek seconded the

motion. When voice ballots were cast Arends abstained, all others voted "AYE". The permit was approved.

The Mayor then explained he and the Council were still tabling the appointment of a building inspector pending the outcome of the recent legislative introductions. Also he hoped to retain a Zoning Coordinator on a fee basis on percentage of permits granted.

Lyle Arends then handed the Mayor \$14 to reimburse the City for the plaque presented to outgoing Councilman Leonard Olson.

Francis Fraser then requested the City purchase a 16mm movie projector for public use. Gary Fread indicated the Telephone Company, Police, etc. also has some need for one and perhaps the Telephone Company could see its way to make such a purchase if it met with the Council's approval. Mr. Fread is to obtain prices, etc.

Benson moved the Council be adjourned and Arends seconded, with all members voting "AYE", the meeting was adjourned.
