

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS  
CROSSLAKE, MINNESOTA  
SPECIAL COUNCIL SESSION  
March 23, 1987 at City Hall

The City Council of Crosslake, Minnesota met in a special session on March 23, 1987 at City Hall. The following members were present: Mayor Oliver Courts and Councilmembers Elizabeth Andolshek and Diana Gallaway. Absent were Councilmembers Lyle Arends and Oliver Yates. Also present were Street Superintendent Pat Hoag, Police Chief John Backdahl, Park Director Patricia Felber, Fire Chief Robert Garin, Clerk/Treasurer Arlene Buchite and Ron Johnson for Bluewaters Computers, Inc. of Pequot Lakes.

Mayor Courts called this meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

Mr. Ron Johnson from Bluewaters Computer, Inc. demonstrated some of the capabilities of the computer for the Councilmembers present and for the department heads. He indicated that they could get all the programs that the City would need and want. The quote submitted was to put a computer, monitor and printer in the clerk's office, in the police department and in the fire department as well as software programs for all three departments. Ms. Felber stated that the Community Center would also greatly benefit by having one available. Computers will be discussed at a later date after a quote is obtained from another company.

Mayor Courts told the Council present that he, Fire Chief Garin and Telephone General Manager Anthony Mayer had gone to Rush City to look at and to hear a warning siren that Rush City had for sale. Mr. Courts said they drove approximately one-half mile away from the siren and in different directions and they could hear it very plainly.

Mr. Garin as Civil Defense Director said the siren would be invaluable to campers in area if a tornado were headed for Crosslake.

MOTION NO. 3S-01-87 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ANDOLSHEK AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY TO PURCHASE THE USED SIREN FROM RUSH CITY AT THE COST OF \$1,500.00. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Councilmember Gallaway asked what funds would be used to pay for the siren and Mayor Courts said it would come out of general savings. The account to be charged will be left up to the Clerk/Treasurer and Auditor.

Chief Backdahl said it will probably be possible to tie the siren in with the Sheriff's Department so that they could set it off or it could be set off by someone locally.

MOTION NO. 3S-02-87 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ANDOLSHEK AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER GALLAWAY TO ADJOURN THIS SPECIAL COUNCIL SESSION AT 3:20 P.M. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
