

April 11, 1975

The Crosslake City Council met in regular session at City Hall. Mayor Fogelberg called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. Present were Councilmen Foss, Olson, Peterson, Andolshek, City Attorney Vigoren and Clerk Perkins.

While considering the minutes of the previous meeting, Councilwoman Andolshek indicated the cost of the additional pay station would be approximately \$1000.00, rather than the expected \$7-800. Councilman Foss then moved, with second by Andolshek to accept the minutes of March 14th, 17th, 31st and April 8th as written. All voting aye.

Andy Andolshek addressed the Council and requested financial assistance for the upkeep on the Crosslake Airport. The area businessmen and pilots have heretofore paid the costs. Projected expenses this summer should be about \$1500.00. Mr. Andolshek indicated the City had pledged \$200.00 last year but it had not been paid. Councilman Foss moved, with second by Olson, to contribute \$500.00 from the General Fund for this purpose. This would in effect pay the \$200.00 yet unpaid and contribute an additional \$300.00 for this year. Motion carried.

Councilman Foss reported on the PCA-County Commissioners meeting he had recently attended. Apparently the County feels its regulations are adequate to regulate and control all operating dumps within the county. Mr. Foss also indicated no emergency funds will be available to reimburse the City for snow removal costs of the winter storms.

Greg Johnson presented a proposal for a group medical insurance plan for city and telephone employees. The Council thanked Mr. Johnson for his efforts and indicated they would give the matter some thought.

Bill Schliek approached the Council with a proposal to develop the land behind City Hall for a ball diamond and skating rink. Bill indicated that some grading would be needed and also it would be good to have a back-stop for the ball park.

Councilman Foss moved, with second by Andolshek, to encourage the use of the land as Mr. Schliek proposed and asked him to bring cost figures for the grading and back-stop to the April 25th meeting for consideration. Motion carried.

The Council approved the request of the Crosslake Girl Scouts to place flower planters at the driveway entrances to the City Hall. The thoughtfulness of the Girl Scouts was much appreciated.

Pat Hoag requested permission to purchase the hand tools needed for the general maintenance work. Councilman Olson is to assist Pat in the purchase and also is to explore the purchase of a brush saw.

Mr. Joel Bensen, Office Manager for Ricke, Carroll, Muller Associates, Inc., was present to discuss future zoning and planning for the City. The primary topic was a sewage system and possible funding for the project.

Mr. Bensen suggested we explore the Urban Studies Program of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers as a possible program for funding a comprehensive plan project for the City.

Mr. Bensen also suggested we request to be placed on a "needs list" with PCA for funding of a sewage project for the City. The Clerk is to consult with Mr. Bensen on this request..

Mr. Bensen indicated his company also had professional planners and one of them would be available to meet with the Council. The Council requested that such a person attend our next session on April 25th. Mr. Bensen said they would confirm this with the Clerk.

Councilman Peterson moved, with second by Foss, that the City take the appropriate steps to be placed on the "needs list" mentioned by Mr. Bensen. Motion carried.

Councilman Peterson moved, with second by Foss, to accept the City and Telephone Reports and pay all bills represented by the vouchers signed prior to the meeting. Carried.

John Backdahl requested permission to go to the Surplus Property Warehouse in Arden Hills and pick-up items for Civil Defense and City use. Permission was granted and the following items suggested if available:

- 50-100 Folding Chairs
- 3 Desks with Chairs
- 5 File Cabinets
- 1 Book Case
- 1 Coat Rack
- Misc. hand tools if available

Bill Reed left a request that the Council be represented at the April 17th Businessmen's meeting to discuss the purchase of the Paster property. In this regard, Councilman Foss requested the Clerk get a letter from the Minnesota League of Municipalities, stating the City's position in such a transaction.

Councilman Peterson made a request for the Whitefish Snow-Goers for a permit for a street dance. All agreed this would be acceptable.

Councilman Foss moved, with second by Andolshek, to adjourn. Carried.
