

April 25, 1975

The regular session of the Crosslake City Council was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Mayor Fogelberg. Present were Councilmen Foss, Andolshek, Peterson and Clerk Perkins. Councilman Olson was absent.

The minutes of the April 11th & 18th were accepted as written by motion of Foss and second of Andolshek. Carried.

In reference to the \$500.00 paid to the Crosslake Airport, Councilman Foss cited the minutes of August 9, 1974, in which the Council committed \$200.00 per year to the airport beginning in 1975. Councilman Foss moved, to rescind the motion of 4/11/75 and inform the Crosslake Airport Committee that the \$500.00 would be applied as per the original motion. This would pay for the years 1975, 1976 and $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1977. The motion was seconded by Peterson and carried.

The question of the vacation of Hill Street (a public access off of Whitefish Avenue) on Manhattan Point was discussed following a request for Council opinion on the matter. The matter was tabled when Councilman Peterson suggested it not be done in light of no obvious public benefit.

Councilman Foss moved, with second by Andolshek, that Peterson pursue the hiring of a full-time Zoning Officer for the City by way of the Minn. CEP program. Carried.

Councilman Foss moved, with second by Andolshek to re-apply for the Federal funds thru DHUD for the community center. The Mayor, City Attorney and City Clerk are to be authorized to sign all applications required. Carried.

Rev. Eric Gustafson addressed the Council and offered the services and help of the community education committee he is working with. The Council accepted the offer with thanks and will do so at such time as a grant for a community center is received.

Pat Uppgaard mentioned a community grant possibly available thru the school district for such a community project. Foss is to explore the possibility with Mr. Vern Dowdy at the Pequot Lakes School.

Mr Bill Schliek presented an estimate for grading the ball park and skating rink behind City Hall. Mr. Lyle Arends had estimated 5-7 hours to prepare the grounds at \$20.00 per hour. Councilman Peterson moved, with second by Andolshek, for Mr. Arends to grade and prepare the land as needed, not to exceed 8 hours and bill the City. Carried.

Mr. Joel Bensen, of RCM, introduced Mr. Terry Mills a professional planner, who gave a slide presentation on the planning process for a municipality. Mr. Mills then discussed the procedure for a city such as our in developing a Comprehensive Plan.

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Councilman Peterson moved, with second by Foss, to instruct Pat Hoag to clear the City roads 40 feet in width and high-stump the trees. Bids will be called for to remove stumps and grade the back-slopes following tree and brush removal. Carried.

Pat is to secure a special burning permit from the State in order to burn the brush during the day time hours.

Councilman Foss moved we instruct the Mayor to purchase an appropriate vacuum cleaner for City Hall. Peterson seconded the motion and all voted aye.

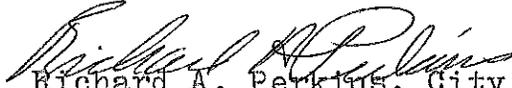
The Council approved use of the City Hall on May 20th for School Board Election.

The Clerk was instructed to contact Jack Vigoren and arrange a special meeting with Don Paster concerning the land purchase.

Peterson reported that the State land located in the City was trust land and could not be sold unless the City condemned the property. The State has no objection to this if the City has a need for the land.

The Clerk reported that Revenue Sharing for the Sixth Period beginning July 1, 1975 would be approximately \$6827.

Councilman Foss moved, with second by Andolshek, to adjourn. Carried.
