

May 14, 1976

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A regular meeting of the Crosslake City Council was called to order at 7:30 P.M. on May 14, 1976 by Mayor Fogelberg. Present, in addition to the Mayor, were Councilmen Foss, Peterson, Andolshek, Olson, Attorney Fritz and Clerk Whisler. Also present were six members of the community.

On a motion by Olson, second by Peterson, all members voting "AYE", the minutes of the April 9th meeting were accepted as written.

On a motion by Foss, second by Andolshek, all members voting "AYE", the minutes of the April 22nd meeting were accepted as written.

On a motion by Foss, second by Andolshek, all members voting "AYE", the minutes of the April 28th meeting were accepted as written.

Robert R. Alderman, Attorney at Law, Brainerd, appeared before the Council to discuss an easement for access to the Janecek property. This involved a piece of property, adjacent to Highway #3, 38' X 30' with a 20' road. On a motion by Foss and a second by Peterson, with all members voting "AYE", it was suggested that Mr. Alderman approach the State with the thought that the State give the entire piece, or a 66' easement to the City as the idea of a 20' road presented problems.

Jan Mezzenga, Zoning Administrator, gave a statistical report consisting of the number and value of the building permits issued during the past twenty-eight months.

Mayor Fogelberg read a letter from the Crosslake Area Associates, Inc. in which they asked for a copy of the proposed city ordinances. The Mayor asked Councilman Peterson to answer the letter.

The Clerk read a letter from the County Highway Department in which they stated that the County Board had not yet received a formal request for re-alignment of a segment of CSAH #6. The Clerk was instructed to provide Mr. Dean Eggena with a copy of the letter.

A request was read from Lowell Lunder to the DNR for permission to remove sand that had washed into the channel near his property. The City Council was asked to act upon the request and to send their comments to the DNR. Councilman Foss moved that the Council act favorably. The motion was seconded by Andolshek. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

Councilman Foss stated that he had received a letter from Gene Foote saying that he would not be able to meet with him prior to the meeting to discuss the City's insurance program.

The Clerk announced that student summer workers could be made available to the City through the MinneCEP program. After some discussion it was decided that the Clerk should inform MinneCEP that the City had no need for such workers.

Without a motion it was decided that the remaining pine trees from the former dump site project should be planted in the area of City Hall.

The next order of business was the voting on the approval or disapproval of liquor licenses in the City.

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Olson moved, with a second by Foss, to approve the following "On Sale" liquor licenses for the year July 1, 1976 through June 30, 1977.

On a motion by Olson and a second by Andolshek, with all Council members voting "AYE", the following dance licenses were granted.

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After the correction of two typographical errors in the City Financial Report, Foss moved, with a second by Peterson, that the report be accepted. All voted "AYE". Motion passed. There was a brief discussion as to whether to continue the Planning Commission checking account or to deposit the funds in a savings account.

On a motion by Olson, with a second by Andolshek, the financial report for the Telephone Company was accepted. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

Police Chief Backdahl gave a statistical report on the activities of the Department for the first quarter of 1976. Two of the most interesting statistics were 92% solution of burglaries and 100% conviction on all apprehensions. The Chief also mentioned a local incident of "defrauding an inn-keeper". Foss moved that the City prosecute. The motion was seconded by Andolshek. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

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For the Telephone Commission, Andolshek reported that they were still waiting for additional news of the REA loan. Councilwoman Andolshek also described some of the benefits she derived from attending a seminar in Fargo.

For the Cemetery Commission, Councilman Olson reported receipts of \$175.00.

For the Roads Commission, Councilmen Peterson and Olson reported that the extent of road construction and repair would be contingent upon the amount of money allowable in the budget.

A letter from the Emily City Council was read in which they expressed interest in a meeting of representatives from surrounding communities to discuss the future of ambulance service in the area. The Clerk was instructed to write an answer voicing the Council's appreciation of Emily's interest.

Under the heading of old business it was decided to wait two weeks before taking any action on the possible sale of the City pick-up. Councilwoman Andolshek stated that she would bring up the subject at the Telephone Commission meeting to see if they might have some practical use for the truck.

A request from James J. Dutcher, Tonka Bay, Minn., was read in which he asked that the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 34, Township 137, Range 27 be changed from a Conservation to a Non-Conservation status. On a motion by Olson, with a second by Andolshek, with all voting "AYE", it was decided that the described property should remain in Conservation.

Under the heading of new business, members of the Council were provided with copies of the proposed new building permit fees as suggested by the Planning Commission. Andolshek moved that the proposed fees be approved by the Council. Olson seconded the motion. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

A resolution was received from the County Auditor's office asking that the Council act on four lots that had recently been declared tax-forfeit. These are Lot 3, Block 2 and Lot 15 Block 10, Manhattan Beach; also, Lots 9 & 10, Big Pine Trail. Olson moved that the four lots be listed as Non-Conservation. Second by Peterson. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

A suggestion that the flag pole in front of the City Hall be extended and a flag be purchased for it was not acted upon.

A discussion was held regarding the adopting of some type ordinance for better control of the dog population of Crosslake. No definite action was taken, but the Clerk was instructed to handle a specific complaint that occurred recently

On a motion by Olson, with a second by Foss, all members voting "AYE", the meeting was adjourned at 10:47 P.M.
