

May 23, 1975

The regular session of the Crosslake City Council was called to order at 7:30 P.M. at City Hall by Mayor Fogelberg. Present were Councilmen Olson, Foss, Andolshek and Clerk Perkins. Councilman Peterson was absent.

Andolshek indicated the figure of \$3500.00 quoted at the May 9th meeting, for the purchase of 100 pr.-22ga. telephone cable would need to be changed. It seems there is a 4856' spool of this cable available at a cost of \$4360.69. This would be somewhat more than needed, however, Mr. Armfield suggested we have extra on hand.

Olson moved, with second by Foss, to modify the motion of May 9th and purchase the 4856' spool of cable. Motion was carried.

Olson moved, with second by Andolshek, to accept the minutes of May 9th, 12th and 13th as written. Carried.

It was decided to advertize for bids on the dozer work on the Big Pine Trail roadway. Olson and Peterson will arrange to take the interested contractors on an on-site tour to explain the work to be done.

Andolshek moved, with second by Olson, for the Clerk to publish an ad for bids on the Big Pine road, bids to be opened and considered at 8:00 P.M. June 13, 1975. Motion carried.

The "City Policy" statement was given consideration. Foss suggested some modifications, which the Council concurred with. The Clerk is to incorporate these changes and also determine the City Attorney's opinion of the statement. The policy statement will be reviewed at the June 13th meeting.

The Clerk presented the circulation figures for the Crow Wing County Review, Brainerd Daily Dispatch and the Country Echo to the Council. Based on the high circulation rate and daily publication convenience, Councilman Foss moved to establish the Brainerd Daily Dispatch as the official publication for the City of Crosslake. The Crow Wing County Review is to be notified of the change. Olson seconded the motion and all voted aye.

The Immaculate Heart Church requested the City to blacktop the northerly 35' of the parking area of the church. This area is on City property. The question of an easement to the Mabel Young property arose. Before taking action, the Clerk is to determine the status of the property and report to the Council.

Mr. Max O'Klock and neighbors approached the Council with a request for the City to assume maintenance of their roadway. Following a lengthy discussion, it was agreed that

Mr. O'Klock would mail the letter, read to the Council, to the State and Federal representatives to determine if help would be available from other sources as well. Mr. O'Klock is to furnish the Clerk with a plat of the property to determine the dedicated width of the road.

The Clerk read the letter received from the Crosslake Area Associates, Inc. The group indicated their withdrawal of support for the purchase of the Paster property and the community center (pending the City showing an overall plan for the project).

Mrs. Cliff Abaas requested a speed limit sign in the area of Beachhead Resort following a recent mishap on the roadway. Foss moved, with second by Olson, for Chief Backdahl to study the situation and post the appropriate signs. Carried.

The application of Miss Deborah Yorek for Reserve Police Officer was considered and approved. Miss Yorek will be on duty only during daylight hours with the regular officer on duty. No motion was made, however, all present indicated consent to the program.

Mayor Fogelberg presented a resolution received from the Crow Wing Coop Power & Light Company. The resolution would give Council support to a transmission line from the Dakotas running across west and central Minnesota.

Olson moved, with second by Andolshek, to table any action on the resolution. Carried.

Foss moved, with second by Olson, to advertize the 1972 Ford squad car for sale by the City. Bids are to be opened at 9:00 P.M. on June 13, 1975. Motion carried.

Mike Hammergren asked the Council their intentions in regard to the purchase of the Paster property.

Councilman Olson moved, with second by Andolshek, to discontinue further negotiations to purchase the property and request the \$1000.00 deposit be returned. Voting was as follows:

Voting aye: Foss, Andolshek and Olson
Voting nay: Fogelberg
Absent: Peterson

Andolshek announced a joint Council-Telephone Commission meeting on May 27th, 2:30 P.M. at City Hall.

Foss moved, with second by Olson, that the Clerk pay \$3700. on the new Police Car from Revenue Sharing Funds and the balance of \$1096.18 from the General Fund. All voted aye.

The Council is to meet on Monday June 2nd at 8:00 A.M. with Don Engen to review the City and Telephone Reports.
