

May 29, 1973

A public hearing was held at 7:30P.M. in the Crosslake Game and Fish Club Building for the purpose of study of a permanent ordinance for the village of Crosslake. (Zoning) All village council members were present along with Mr. H. M. Hermanson, Richard Perkins and Wm. Shields of the Planning Commission.

The complete ordinance was read and proposed changes noted by the Commission.

Various local people were in attendance, including Mr. Orval Nelson, Leo Fraser, Dorothy Allen, James Cotton, R. E. Schalow and Otto Schalow. This group expressed dis-satisfaction of the proposed change in certain lands from Commercial to Residential, and a letter from R. E. Schalow to the Planning Commission and Council was read into the record, which asked that the Council either allow his land to remain as Commercial or change to residential and allow for reasonable expansion, provided the business remained as is presently conducted which is "wholesale" and provides for no manufacturing of products.

After this meeting adjourned the village council met in special session.

This meeting was called to order by Mayor Kluender.

On motion of Coulter and second by Foss and Off Sale 3.2 license was granted to Mr. Andy Andolshek for the Crosslake Store. All members voting aye.

On motion of Coulter and second by Foss, A. R. and S. H. Stenson of the Exchange were granted the following licenses: Off Sale Liquor, On Sale Liquor, Sunday Liquor and Dance licenses for year of 7-1-73 thru 6-30-74. All members voting aye.

On motion of Foss and second by Olson, Kim Laurence of Echo Ridge was granted an On Sale Liquor, Sunday Liquor and Dance License for the year of 7-1-73 thru 6-30-74. All members voting aye.

On motion of Foss and second by Olson Mr. Donald Vaux of the Riverside was granted an On Sale Liquor, Off Sale Liquor and Sunday Liquor License. All members voting aye.

On motion of Schneider and second by Olson a cigarette license was granted Harold Johnson of Birch Crest Resort, and Sandy Scavo Jr. of Sandy's Pizza. All members voting aye.

The clerk advised that the Stenson's had asked the village position relating to the liquor sale to 18 year olds. The council indicated that they thought it best to wait to see what kind of ruling was made by the Attorney General's office on this matter. Present village ordinances do spell out 21 as minimum age. Council indicated that unless the opinion from the Attorney General indicated otherwise that our ordinance would have to be enforced until changed.

A special meeting was discussed for 5-31-73 at 2:00P.M. if Councilman Coulter is advised by our attorney that a delay in the publishing of the new ordinance would be undesirable. Members to be advised after Mr. Coulter hears from Tom Ryan.

On motion of Foss with second by Olson the meeting adjourned.
