

Crosslake City Council
July 8, 1982 - 7:00 PM - SPECIAL MEETING

The special meeting was called to order by Mayor Carol Coulter at 7:00 PM. Councilmen present were Andolshek, Arends and Delmonico. There were about 6 members of the community present.

Councilman Delmonico explained that an engine must be replaced in the oldest squad car. Two estimates have been received; Mills Motor for \$1,640.65 and Al York for \$1,667.41. Delmonico stated that as long as Al York was a local businessman he felt the city should consider his estimate as the prices were not that far apart.

MOTION: By Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek that the city accept the proposal of Al York in the amount of \$1,667.41 for the replacement of the engine in the squad car and the necessary work that goes along with this. Coulter, Andolshek, and Delmonico voted "AYE", Arends abstained. The motion carried.

When Arends questioned the necessity of the third police car, Delmonico stated that when the Telephone Company needs a truck to do their business better, when the Fire Department needs a truck to do their job better, when the Maintenance Department needs a truck to conduct their business there is never any controversy on any of these but when the Police Department needs equipment there is always someone to complain. He suggested that some of the people who are so vehemently against it should ride in a squad car some week end and find out what it is all about.

MOTION: By Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek that the meeting be adjourned. The meeting was adjourned at 7:14 PM.
