

July 11, 1975

The regular session of the Crosslake City Council was called to order by Mayor Fogelberg at 7:30 PM. Present were Councilmen Foss, Andolshek, Petersen, Olson, Clerk Perkins, City Attorney Vigoren, and zoning coordinator Backstrom.

Councilman Petersen moved, with second by Foss, to accept the June 27, 1975 minutes as written. All voting "Aye", Motion carried.

Mike Costello questioned the Council as to their intentions for Blacktopping the Happy Landing road. He asked where the road was on the priority list. (He was informed many other roads also needed surfacing and presently the Council was trying to determine an acceptable way to finance the work.)

Mr Ed Perkins addressed the Council in regard to placement of a marker which does not conform to Cemetery regulations. He felt it proper to place any type of marker he wanted on the grave and indicated the Little Falls Granite Works had told him he could do so.

Petersen moved, with second by Foss, to instruct the Clerk to write a letter to the Little Falls Granite Works informing them of their responsibility to adhere to the present Cemetery regulations.  
Voting "AYE"- Foss, Petersen, Fogelberg, Olson.  
Voting Nay- Andolshek Motion carried.

Mr Perkins requested a letter from the Council stating he could not place the marker he has purchased. Foss moved, with a second by Olson, that City Attorney Vigoren write such a letter to Mr Perkins. All members voting "AYE". Motion carried.

Councilman Foss reported regarding his follow-up work on the audit. He indicated spending time with the Clerk and Treasurer to review the changes being made at this level. He suggested a meeting with the Fire Department Chief to discuss Relief Association procedure. Mr Foss indicated a need for the Council to meet informally to discuss some details regarding future procedure in these areas.

Councilman Foss moved for the adoption of the following:  
PROPOSED RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH SEPARATE CEMETERY ACCOUNTS

WHEREAS, on May 21, 1968, the Crosslake Village Council did dedicate the sum of \$3,000.00 to a Cemetery Fund, and did place said amount in deposit, bearing 5% interest at First Federal Savings and Loan, together with other Village monies, and

WHEREAS, said funds with accumulated interest now total \$4,550.67 and are difficult to maintain separate accounting of while on deposit with other City monies, and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to deposit these monies in a separate account for more accurate accountin and access,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$4,550.67 be withdrawn from the account in First Federal Savings and Loan and re-deposited in the Lakeland State Bank, Pequot Lakes, Minnesota as:

\$4,050.67 in an interest bearing account

\$500.00 in a checking account

said accounts to be entitled as Cemetery Fund with all Cemetery receipts and disbursements being passed through said accounts.

Motion seconded by Olson.

Voting "AYE"- Foss, Olson, Petersen, Andolshek, Fogelberg.

Voting "Nay"- None.

Mr Ed McCulloch of the Minnesota Highway Department was present to discuss a traffic survey for Crosslake. The point of his presentation was having the City determine problem roads and request a study only on these roads, as the City pays a fee per mile for this work. The Council instructed Chief Backdahl to determine problem areas and report these to the Council.

City Attorney indicated it was necessary to determine a specific use, before requesting a change of the use restriction on the City Dump Property deed. Vigoren was asked to explore the possibility of calling for recreational use on the deed.

Councilman Olson moved, with a second by Petersen, that the Telephone Company purchase 24 "C" relay kits for the central office board. There are 40 currently on back order, so this would be a total of 64 relays to be received. Cost is approximately \$15.50 each.

All members voting "AYE". Motion carried.

Councilman Olson moved, with a second by Petersen, that the Clerk advertise for bids to doze and clear the right-of-way on approximately 3/4 mile of the Goodrich-Obrien roadway. Bids to be opened the first meeting in August (August 8)

All members voting "AYE". Motion carried.

Olson asked if Vigoren would determine the procedure necessary to assess fronting property for a portion of road improvements.

Councilman Petersen moved, with a second by Foss, that Attorney Vigoren and the Crosslake Police issue a citation charging Elton Hess with an alleged violation of the Crosslake Zoning Ordinance. Specifically, building an addition without a permit called for in Article 111, Section 3.20; Article XI, section 11.20, 11.23 and chargeable according to Article XV, section 15.10

Voting "AYE"- Foss, Olson, Petersen, Andolshek, Fogelberg.

Voting Nay- None Motion carried.

Due to the fact that the notice of Public Hearing was not published in due time, it was necessary to re-publish and hold a second hearing, in regard to the Zoning Ordinance Amendment eliminating Boathouse construction. Therefore, Councilman Petersen moved to adopt the following:

The City Council of Crosslake do ordain:

1. That portion of Ordinance 6A, Article VIII, Section 8.10 which reads, "Boathouses and related recreational structures may be placed on waterfronts provided that they do not have interior sanitary systems, unless such sanitary systems meet the requirements of Section 10.11, shall be deleted in its entirety from such section.

2. The provisions of the amendment shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication, and shall cover all areas of the City of Crosslake as it now presently exists,

Councilman Olson seconded the motion.

Voting "AYE"- Foss, Olson, Petersen, Andolshek, Fogelberg

Voting Nay- None

All members voting "Aye". Motion carried.

Councilman Petersen moved, with second by Foss, that the City Maintenance provide the labor to paint the Telephone Central Office. The Telephone Company is to supply the paint.  
All members voting "Aye". Motion carried.

Councilman Andolshek reported that Ed Johnson asked if Police assistance was available to direct traffic as Church is dismissed on Sunday mornings This was in regard to Lutheran Services at the Drive-In Church.

The odor problem at the Exchange Laundromat was mentioned. Mayor Fogelberg is to contact the Minnesota Dept. of Health in regard to the matter.

Councilman Foss moved, with second by Olson, that the meeting adjourn.
