

July 20, 1974

A duly called Special Meeting of the Crosslake council was held at 2:00P.M. in the Game and Fish Building--after being moved from the City Hall to make room for the crowd attending.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Kluender. Present were Mayor Kluender, Councilman Schneider, Coulter, Olson and Foss. Also present was clerk Schalow.

Councilman Coulter read aloud his letter which was presented to council members earlier this month. The letter called for the immediate hiring of a third patrolman for the City. The crowd appeared to be pretty evenly divided as to those who felt that there was a need for a third officer and those that felt there was no need. A discussion of some 90 minutes took place, after which Councilman Olson indicated he would like a show of hands on the matter. Mayor Kluender then asked that this be done, and a quick count showed that 25 of those attending were opposed to the hiring and 27 were in favor.

Councilman Coulter then moved that we advertise for applications for hiring a third patrolman at once and review the applications on August 9th. Second by Foss. Roll call Vote: Aye Foss, Coulter, Kluender  
Nay Olson and Schneider

At this point most of the group left the meeting and the council considered the following.

On motion of Schneider and second by Foss the hours of election for the Primary Election were set as 2:00P.M. to 8:00P.M. All members voting aye.

On motion of Coulter and second by Schneider the City formally accepted the road which has been built by the Eskesen's within their plat of Survey. On Gov.t. Lot 5, Sec. 10, T137N, R27W. The Eskesen's now must furnish a Warranty Deed to the City for the tract of land within the survey that the road is built on. All members voting aye.

On motion of Olson and second by Schneider the clerk was instructed to obtain election judges for the primary election. Number of judges to be 4, and they are to be selected from the following names. Al Kaun, Isabell Agrell, R. Day, Thelma Sorenson, Agnes Miller, Carl Hoel, Barb Hilsabeck, Dorthy Schilz, Mabel Young.

On motion of Olson and second by Coulter the rate of pay was set at \$2.20 per hour. The 4 judges selected for the Primary will also be judges at the general election, and 4 additional judges will be selected for the General which will enable them to work in two shifts.

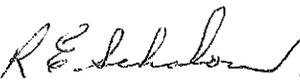
The clerk presented a Lakeshore Change Application from Mrs. R. J. Ziehwein. Councilman Schneider indicated that he felt this application should be denied because it appears that the request to fill in the shoreline is merely a way of making legal a building being considered on an adjoining lot. Councilman Foss indicated that this question should be resolved by the Planning Commission. The clerk was asked to forward the request to Alvin Peterson and ask for Planning Commission recommendation.

The clerk brought up the matter of an application for Kiddie Rides to be run on the old airport property. There was some discussion as to whether this matter pertained to a money raising matter the Chamber of Commerce was giving consideration. Councilman Schneider indicated that Donald Jay has indicated

that it was a Chamber sponsored program. Councilman Coulter asked that no vote be taken until such time as a formal letter from the Chamber has been received. The clerk indicated that because of the shortness of time that it might be well to consider what course of action should be taken should this letter be received. It was then moved by Olson and seconded by Schnieder that if the letter of request is received from the Chamber that the permit be granted provided that the applicant

- a. Obtain the property owners permission.
- b. Provide ample sanitation facilities
- c. Provide for police protection during the hours of promotion.
- d. Make a complete cleanup of the area at the end of the promotion.

On motion of Olson and second by Coulter the meeting adjourned. Mr. Foss indicated that he had prepared a list of items to be given some thought and study and action as quickly as possible. At this point a roll call vote was taken on the motion and the meeting adjourned.
