

August 22, 1975

The regular session of the Crosslake City Council was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Fogelberg. Present were Councilmen Olson, Foss, Petersen, Andolshek and Clerk Perkins.

The subject of maintenance on a portion of the Goodrich-O'Brien road was again discussed. Mr Strand and Mr Farmer were present at the meeting. Apparently the residents, or Mr Strand as the case may be, want the City to pledge maintenance and then they will try to raise money to bring the road up to standards called for by the Council. Councilman Olson expressed the position that the up-grading should be completed and paid for by the residents before the maintenance is assumed. The letter from Attorney Vigoren was introduced in which he suggests the City does not necessarily have to assume the responsibility for the maintenance of the road in question. The situation was not resolved so Councilman Olson moved, with a second by Foss, to postpone action until September 12, 1975, when the City Attorney would be present. The Clerk is to provide Mr Strand a copy of Attornet Vigorens letter. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

The Clerk reported petitions had been received to vacate three streets or Alleys in the City.

Councilman Petersen moved, with second by Olson, to adopt the following three resolutions:

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

The Clerk reported that the Minn. Dept. of Health, Mr Ralph Carlson, takes no jurisdiction in the Exchange Laundromat sewage odor problem. Mr Carlson indicated a willingness to talk with the Planning Commission. However, chose to suggest the Planning Comm. and Mr Stenson work together to solve the problem. The Council indicated Mr Backstrom should initiate efforts to see the problem eliminated.

Councilwoman Andolshek reported as Telephone Commission business:

1. Attorney Robert Johnson has indicated that apparently the Telephone System can sell a single bond to R E A for the entire amount needed. This can be done with no referendum vote by the residents.
2. Attorney Johnson indicated he would meet with the Council sometime around September 9th to set up a program.
- 3 The Telephone Commission intends to write to Arvig Telephone requesting transfer of areas, served by Arvig in Crosslake, to the Watertown System.


Tom Woog indicated that he felt the business community was generating the majority of Telephone toll revenue in Crosslake and therefore, should be entitled to private line service. Ms Andolshek indicated the new system would accomplish just that.

Councilman Olson indicated the need for the Road Commission to establish priorities on road maintenance and construction and also determine the feasibility of assessments for future construction.

Councilwoman Andolshek moved, with second by Foss, to offer the County \$100.00 for the 40 acre tract formerly used as a Township Dump. The Clerk is to approach the Board of Commissioners with the offer to determine what the County would accept for the property. The County had indicated previously to the Clerk that they would sell the property out-right to the City.
All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

Councilman Olson moved, with second by Foss, to instruct the Clerk to advertise for hourly rate bids for snowplowing this winter.
All voted "AYE".
Motion Carried.

Councilman Olson moved, with second by Andolshek, to adjourn
