The meeting was called to order by Mayor Carol Coulter at 10:00 AM. Councilmen present were Andolshek, Arends and Delmonico. Councilman Anderson was out of town on business. There were about six members of the community present.


The Mayor turned the meeting over to Lyle Arends, Council Liason for Planning & Zoning for their recommendation in regard to the proposed laundromat. Mr. Arends then turned the meeting over to Charles Miller, Zoning Coordinator as Arends was not present at the meeting when the Commission made the recommendation.

Mr. Miller stated that the Planning & Zoning Commission has recommended that the permit issuance be approved for the proposed full time attendant laundromat with fourteen washers and eight dryers on a piece of property that is 200' by 400' feet that is situated between the Dairy Queen and the old Telephone Company building.

MOTION: By Arends and seconded by Delmonico that the council accept the recommendation of the Planning & Zoning Commission that a permit be issued for the proposed laundromat as stated above. The question was asked as to what kind of a septic system will be installed and Mr. Miller stated that it will be a PCA approved system. The name of the owner was requested and Mary Jane Johnson, real estate agent, stated it will be Lee Jenson. She stated the existing building will be used while they are building the new building. They plan on opening on March 1 or April 1, 1982. After the above discussion the matter was voted on and all members voted, "AYE"; the motion carried and the vote was unanimous.

On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek that the meeting be adjourned. All members voting, "AYE", the meeting was adjourned at 10:05 AM.
