

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS
CITY OF CROSSLAKE MINNESOTA
SPECIAL COUNCIL SESSION
AUGUST 29, 1988
9:30 a.m. at City Hall

The City Council of Crosslake Minnesota met in a special session on Monday, August 29, 1988 in the Council Chambers of City Hall. The following members were present: Mayor Oliver Courts, and Councilmembers Lyle Arends, Dean Swanson and Oliver Yates. Absent was Councilmember Diana Gallaway. Also present were Fire Chief David Schlick, Police Chief John Backdahl, Road Supervisor Pat Hoag and City Clerk Arlene Buchite. There were no citizens present.

Mayor Courts called this special meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. stating that the primary purpose for this meeting was to discuss and cut budgets because we are still approximately \$70,000.00 from balancing.

Discussion ensued regarding the possibility of keeping the money for recodification set aside for 1989 if the codification is not completed this year so as not to budget \$2,000.00 for it. It was the consensus of the Council that if the money is needed for codification next year it can come from the general fund.

After much discussion and cutting, Clerk Buchite indicated that we are still \$29,827 from balancing. Mayor Courts said he felt that we may have to go to the Auditor's Office for assistance. MOTION NO. 8S4-01-88 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER YATES TO HAVE MAYOR COURTS AND CLERK BUCHITE GO TO THE AUDITOR'S OFFICE TO SEE IF THEY CAN GIVE US ANY HELP IN BALANCING THE BUDGET. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

Councilmember Arends stated that he has talked to Mr. Tom Woog about purchasing some property to the West of the existing cemetery. Mr. Woog is going to discuss it with his brother who owns the property and will get back to Mr. Arends.

With no further business, MOTION NO. 8S4-02-88 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER ARENDS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER SWANSON TO ADJOURN THIS SPECIAL COUNCIL SESSION AT 11:25 A.M. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
