

September 12, 1975

This regular session of the Crosslake City Council was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Fogelberg. Present were Councilmen Andolshek, Foss, Petersen, Olson and Clerk Perkins, Attorney Wigoren, Planning Commission Chairman Shields and Roland Backstrom.

Councilman Foss moved, with second by Olson, to accept the minutes of August 22, September 4th and September 9th ~~minutes~~ as written. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

The Clerk reported that the County Board intended to evaluate the timber on the dump property and inform the City as to its value.

A special budget meeting was set for September 18, 1975, at 7:30 P.M. at the City Hall.

Councilman Petersen suggested that the Council hold a public hearing on the telephone project in order to inform people of the proposed plans for the system. With the exception of Mayor Fogelberg, the Council agreed this was an excellent idea.

Councilman Olson asked if there were any objections to installing an electric base-board heater in the Police Office. The cost would be \$50.00-\$75.00. There was no objection to the request.

Councilman Olson moved, with a second by Andolshek, to allow free use of a City Hall room to the Lutheran Church on Sunday mornings as a class room. All voted "AYE" Motion carried.

The Clerk indicated that Mr Armfield had apologized to Mr Don Engen, CPA, for the statement that his audit was not appropriate to a utility. Mr Armfield indicated he had not read the entire audit before making the statement.

Backstrom appeared before the Council to make a report concerning Zoning activities he had been involved in.

Backstrom presented the Commercial permit request of Larry Olson for an ice plant located in the Riverview plat. Petersen moved, with second by Andolshek, that the permit be granted upon recommendation of the Planning Commission. All voted "AYE" Motion carried.

Olson moved, with second by Foss, to approve the Commercial permit for Crosslake Lumber Company to make a 20' X 48' addition to a building. All voted "Aye". Motion carried.

Backstrom indicated he would file a Planning Commission report thru September 15th and expected his normal portion of the fees for that time. Petersen moved, with second by Andolshek, to pay Backstrom the fees normally due up to September 15, 1975. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

Councilman Foss moved, with second by Olson, to instruct the Planning Commission to act immediately on the Exchange Sewer problem. They are to give the owners 30 days upon notice to correct the problem. All voted "AYE". Motion carried

The Council instructed Attorney Vigoren to contact Attorney Alderman in regard to the Bon Repoz resort dispute with Timberlane. Jack is to report the results of the contact.

The Planning Commission was instructed to determine the status of the camper hook-ups at the Scenic Motel. Do they have a permit or license, or need one ?

Foss moved, with second by Olson, to accept the City Financial Report and bills represented by checks #2380 thru 2418. All voted "Aye". Motion carried.

Petersen moved, with second by Foss, for the Clerk to purchase \$20,000.00 in Treasury Bills on a 6 month term. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

The Council indicated that in the future no liability will be assumed for Employees clothing damaged while working.

Councilwoman Andolshek moved that the Telephone tolls for other than telephone business, hereafter be paid by the City. Olson seconded the motion. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.


Petersen moved, with second by Andolshek, to accept the Telephone report and pay all bills represented by checks #3707 thru 3761. All voted "AYE". Motion carried.

Ms Carolyn Walter approached the Council with a request that the City declare the road and bridge to Little Pine Island as a public road. The request related to the School district not crossing the bridge because it was private and some residents had objected to its use by the Bus. Ms Walter has a handicapped daughter who is unable, during winter months, to walk across the bridge to the school bus. The Council indicated no opinion as to whether the road was public or private, only that the City does not presently assume maintenance of said road or bridge.

Roland Strand again approached the Council regarding maintenance of McClintock road. Attorney Vigoren indicated he only had five of the needed eight signatures on the petition. After a lengthy discussion Attorney Vigoren told Mr Strand he should arrange up-grading of the roadway at the property owners expense and then return to the Council with his request for maintenance.

Attorney Vigoren informed the Council he will be moving from the area, therefore, the Council will need to seek the services of a new Attorney before the end of October. Mr Vigoren introduced Attorney Harold Fritz who had purchased his practice and would be available on the same fee basis should the City desire his services.

Petersen moved, with second by Foss, to adjourn. All voted "AYE". Motion carried
