A special meeting of the Crosslake City Council was called to order by Mayor Fogelberg at 11:00 A.M. on Sept. 29, 1977 in City Hall. The purpose of the meeting was opening of bids on central office and equipment building.

Seated at the Council table were the Mayor, Councilmen Olson, Arends, Andolshek, Clerk Whisler, Jerry Kook, representing REA, and Carl Nordquist, architect for the proposed building. Councilman Benson was absent. Also in attendance were Gary Fread, manager of Crosslake Telephone Co., and fourteen others, most of whom represented the firms submitting bids.

Mayor Fogelberg, after calling the meeting to order, turned the chair over to Councilman Andolshek who, in her capacity as chairman of the Telephone Commission, would conduct the meeting.

Mrs. Andolshek greeted those in attendance and explained the purpose of the meeting. She further explained the City Clerk would open the bids and pass them to Mr. Nordquist and Mr. Kook who would check them for completeness and for the dollar amount of the bids.

The names of those submitting bids, together with the dollar amounts, are listed below. Alt. #1 is for electric door openers. Alt. #2 is for construction and blacktopping of City Hall portion of the approach driveway and parking area.

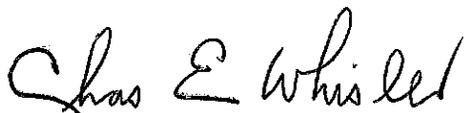
It was announced all of these bids were in excess of the budgeted amount (\$177,000.00) and the matter would have to be taken under advisement with final announcement being made at a later meeting.

The Telephone Company business being accomplished, Mayor Fogelberg stated there should be discussion of the proposed all-purpose community building, and the grant involved.

Elmer Pearson, chairman of the Parks Commission, announced they had received the certification from the E.D.A. the previous day and it would be necessary to return it within five days and begin construction within ninety days.

The Mayor then moved the certification be signed and returned. It was explained this would not entail submitting final plans for the building, but merely indicate a willingness to accept the grant. Andolshek seconded the motion. When the question was put to the Council, Fogelberg, Arends and Andolshek voted "AYE". Olson abstained. Motion carried and so ordered.

Andolshek moved the meeting be adjourned. Olson seconded the motion. All voted "AYE". Meeting was adjourned at 11:28 A.M.
