

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS
Crosslake, Minnesota
SPECIAL SESSION - October 3, 1983

The City Council of Crosslake, Minnesota met in a special session on September 1, 1983 at 7:30 P.M. at the Telephone Company Conference Room. The following members were present: Councilman Anderson, Arends, Nelson, Allen and Mayor Bieber. The Telephone Commission members were also present.

The meeting was called to order and Mr. Anthony Mayer introduced the order of business as that being the cable television tower. Mr. Mayer introduced first some background on the requirement change in the tower due to the possibility of mounting micro-wave discs to the tower. Further explained that the tower that bids were publicized for would be inferior to our needs at present. This situation was further explained as only coming about in the last two weeks which was after bids had been requested. Bids were opened at this time.

Further discussion introduced the need of soil testing to determine how deep the base would be. Also introduced was the extra cost of the tower due to the micro-wave discs would be ratioed against the Telephone Company.

Also introduced was the costs of procuring a trencher for which prices were introduced as proposed by Ditch Witch of Minnesota at a cost of \$42,672.50 for a new 5010. Trailer prices were also introduced.

Further prices were introduced on the Cable Television System Proposal of A at 18 to 24 months installation time, B at 6 months installation time and C at 6 to 8 weeks installation time. Proposals A and B were introduced in detail and was determined that the City should proceed under Proposal B.

MOTION NO. 10S-01-83 was introduced by Councilman Anderson that we adjourn. SECONDED BY Councilman Nelson. Upon roll call vote being taken all members of the council voted in favor of said motion and Mayor Bieber declared the motion carried.
