SPECIAL COUNCIL SESSION  
October 29, 1986  
9:00 a.m. at City Hall


The City Council of Crosslake, Minnesota met in a special session on October 29, 1986 in the Council Chambers of City Hall. The purpose of this meeting was to review and accept or reject the bids for the new warehouse for the Crosslake Telephone Company. The following members were present: Mayor August Mezzenga and Councilmen Robert Allen, Oliver Courts and Orval Nelson. Absent was Councilman Oliver Yates. Also present was Anthony Mayer, Manager of Crosslake Telephone Company and approximately 8 citizens of whom some were contractors and local businessmen.

Mayor Mezzenga called this special council session to order at 9:00 a.m. Manager Mayer had prepared a list of bidders and amounts of the bids which were submitted and opened at the Telephone Commission meeting on October 28, 1986 at 2:00 p.m. The bids received were: 1. Crosslake Construction for \$28,779.58; 2. Frank Peterson for \$34,999.99; 3. Curtis J. Heikennen for \$35,903.00; 4. C.E.P. Construction for \$36,289.00; 5. Neiman, Dave-Burns & Associates for \$45,599.00; and 6. Northern Carpentry for \$45,900.00.

With permission from the Mayor, Leo Fraser asked Dean Eggena of Crosslake Construction if he had checked his bid over for any discrepancies and to see that everything was in his bid to complete the building including good workmanship. Mr. Eggena said he had gone over the bid the previous evening and was confident he could build it for the amount of the bid. MOTION NO. 10S-01-86 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN ALLEN AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN COURTS TO ACCEPT THE BID FROM CROSSLAKE CONSTRUCTION FOR \$28,779.58 TO BUILD THE WAREHOUSE ACCORDING TO THE PLANS. Discussion ensued as to the load limit of the roof. Mr. Mayer said they stated the roof should be sufficient to withstand Northern Minnesota winters and snow loads. Some of the contractors who had submitted bids had bid on a 40 pound load and others had bid on a 30 pound load limit. Discussion also ensued whether the building specifications used were for commercial or agricultural building. Mr. Mayer indicated that Crosslake does not have a building code. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

MOTION NO. 10S-02-86 WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN ALLEN AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN COURTS TO ADJOURN THIS REGULAR COUNCIL SESSION AT 9:16 A.M. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
