

The regular meeting of the Crosslake City Council was called to order by Mayor Charles E. Whisler at 7:30 PM. Councilmen Arends, Andolshek, Delmonico and Benson were present. There were about 18 members of the community present.

On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Arends to approve the minutes of the October 13, 1980 meeting. All members voting, "AYE", the motion carried.

On a motion by Arends and seconded by Delmonico that the Treasurer's report for October be approved as submitted. All members voting, "AYE", the motion carried.

On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Arends that the Telephone Company's financial report for October be approved as submitted. All members voting, "AYE", the motion carried.

The mayor announced that the agenda would be altered to allow the decision on the bid for the equipment for the new truck to come first. Benson announced that the bids were opened on November 7th, 1980 at the Clerk's Office at 4:00 PM. On a motion by Benson and seconded by Arends that we accept the lowest bid by Bryan Equipment of Merri-field for \$13,375.59 as submitted. All members voting, "AYE", the motion carried.

The mayor announced that the canvassing board of the city council certified the election returns of the city as submitted by the judges and declared the following persons elected by the following vote total:

The mayor announced that duly elected officials will be sworn in at the December meeting to become effective on January 1, 1980.

On a motion by Andolshek and seconded by Arends that we empower the newly elected mayor to attend the mayor's conference in Minneapolis on November 21st and 22nd for a registration fee of \$45. plus mileage and meals. All members voting, "AYE", the motion carried.

The mayor stated that he had a request from the Sunshine Pre-School Ass'n. that the city consider passing an ordinance pertaining to gambling by non-profit organizations. The mayor will check into this further with the company that is drawing up our codification.

The clerk stated that she had received an application by the Crosslake Men's Club to play Bingo at the Immaculate Heart Church Hall on

November 21, 1980, from 7:00 PM to 9:30 PM with the proceeds being donated to charity. On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Arends that a permit be issued to the Crosslake Men's Club to play Turkey Bingo as stated above. All members voting, "AYE", the motion carried.

On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek that the clerk be instructed to draw up a resolution changing the polling hours to 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM as per the clerk's request. All, "AYE". Carried.

Delmonico stated that the dividend to the city from the Telephone Company will be \$28,000. or \$29,000. instead of the anticipated \$24,000. The Telephone Company's budget has been distributed and decisions will have to be made at the next council meeting. Council should meet with the Telephone Commission before that time.

Andolshek announced that the cemetery has been staked for the winter.

In discussing the possible renovation of city hall as to whether a referendum was necessary it was decided that the auditor, Don Engen, be contacted and perhaps legal counsel and then the committee will meet to make further plans.

On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek that Helen Kilian's salary from the Telephone Company be raised by 50¢ an hour as recommended by the Telephone Commission to be effective January 1, 1981-82. All members voting, "AYE", the motion carried.

Clerk was instructed to contact Duane Blanck to find out if snow-mobiling can be permitted on the bicycle path. She will mention that we would like to have a speed limit of 15 miles put on this.

Upon a request from Lowell Perkins that the city pay for the additional cost of running an electric tank heater for police cars. Clerk to check with Perkins to see how much he would expect for this.

The park is checking a grant for \$2,000. from the Otto Bremer Foundation for playground and ballfield equipment as stated by Delmonico. The second hockey rink is completed. On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek that the council approve the appointment of Wayne Schwartz to replace Wm. Beasley on the Park Commission as recommended by the Commission. All voting, "AYE", the motion carried.

On a motion by Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek that the registration fee, mileage and meals be paid for Patty Felber to attend the Conference of Recreation and Park Directors. All voting, "AYE", motion carried.

Arends stated that permits issued for the year through October are approximately \$1400. ahead of last year. Arends stated that the Planning and Zoning Commission had issued two penalties - Marvin Overton for \$100. and Jack Felber for \$150. (Contractor penalty).

On a motion by Andolshek and seconded by Delmonico that the meeting be adjourned at 8:15 PM. All members voting, "AYE", motion carried.
