

December 20, 1974

This special session of the Crosslake City Council was called to order at 9:00A.M. at City Hall by Mayor Fogelberg. Present were Councilmen Olson, Peterson, Andolshek and Clerk Perkins. Visitors were P. Hoag, R. Mertens, R. Schmidt and Doris Shafer.

The Clerk read a letter he had prepared to send to Mr. Fred Casey, offering to him the position of City Attorney. Mayor Fogelberg had contacted Mr. Casey previously, at which time he had consented to act as attorney for the city. Councilman Andolshek moved, with second by Peterson, to retain Mr. Casey as City Attorney if he is agreeable. All voting aye. (His appointment to be effective Jan. 1, 1975.) To receive \$30.00/ meeting.

Mayor Fogelberg indicated that the Pastor property will be available for snowmobiling for the general public. Mike Hammigren will provide a letter granting such permission.

The initial recommendation for salary adjustments was 10% for Hoag, Mertens and Schmidt. They felt this was not adequate in light of present rising costs. Councilman Olson moved, with second by Andolshek, to increase all three of these by \$.50/hour which would be:

Rod Mertens:	\$4.50/hr.
Ron Schmidt:	4.00/hr.
Pat Hoag:	4.00/hr.

All members voting aye.

A motion by Olson, with second by Andolshek, increased Doris Shafer's rate to \$3.00/hr.; John Backdahl from \$775/mo. to \$852.50/mo.; Helen Fraser from \$255/mo. to \$280.50/mo. Patrolman salaries to be considered at the end of their 6 month probationary period. All voting aye.

These adjustments to become effective January 1, 1975.

Perkins questioned the necessity of a legal opinion of Mayor Kluender's appointment of a Telephone Commission. New appointments being made in January, any answer would serve little purpose at this time. Councilman Olson said that he would withdraw his motion and request.

Mr. & Mrs. Clayton Hamilton of Conifer Labs then came into the meeting. They had been asked to come and discuss their intentions as far as the continued use of the rooms in City Hall were concerned. They asked the Council to allow them to lease the space for next year. They indicated that some money would soon be coming from their business and they would be able to meet their obligations. Councilman Peterson moved, with second by Olson, to write a new lease for 6 months at the same monthly rates. All voting aye. No arrangements were made to clear up the 4 months rent now in arrears. The Clerk is to draw-up a new lease.

Kurt Anderson and Glen Mc Mullan were mentioned as being available to serve on the Planning Commission. No action was taken at this time.

Councilman Olson moved, with second by Peterson, to adjourn.
