

Dec. 27, 1973

A special meeting of the Crosslake village council was held at 1:00P.M. in the Village hall. The meeting was called to order by Acting Mayor Coulter. Present were Councilmen Schneider and Olson, Acting mayor Coulter and R. E. Schalow, Clerk. Mayor Kluender arrived a few minutes late. Absent: Councilman Foss

Purpose of the meeting was to meet with Ronald Schmidt, a candidate for the job opening in the telephone system. Mr. Schmidt came to us, with a recommendation of the Wadena Area Tech. School. He indicated that he specialized in C.O training and that he graduated in the middle third of his class.


After an interview which lasted about 30 minutes, and during which Mr. Schmidt indicated that he would be able to start work on January 7th, if he were accepted, provided that he received notification by Jan 2, 1974, Mr. Schmidt left the meeting.

After he left the meeting, Councilman Olson indicated that a man by the name of John Swenson had indicated an interest in the job. Mr Olson did not know what qualifications this man might have but indicated that he worked for the Fargo Telephone Co.

In view of the shortness of time in which we have to train a new man, it was moved by Coulter and seconded by Schneider that the clerk notify Mr. Schmidt on January 2nd, 1974 that the job is offered to him. In event there are additional candidates available prior to that day, the clerk will contact the council and arrange for interviews. (No other candidates were heard from--and notification was given to Mr. Schmidt on Jan 2, 1974) Starting salary to be based on \$3.00 per hr., with 40 hour week. Adjustment of salary after 6 months of satisfactory employment..

The clerk read a note from Guy Wannebo which indicated that about \$750.00 would be required to update the Scavo road in the plat of Sandra's Shores. Inasmuch as the village was holding a cash bond in amount of \$1,000.00 it was moved by Coulter and seconded by Olson to issue a check in amount of \$250.00 to Sandy Scavo to cover the difference.

On motion of Schneider and second by Coulter the meeting adjourned.
