NOTICE TO BITUMINOUS CONTRACTORS
Sealed proposals will be received by the Clerk of the Village of Crosslake, Crow Wing County, Minnesota, until the hour of 7:00 P.M. on the 16th day of April, 1969, for the performance of the following work:
The construction of a Bituminous Mat eighteen (18) feet wide and one and one half (1½) inches thick on the so called Shafer Road, for a distance of approximately five tenths of one mile (5/10).
The following quantities are involved:
Approximately 5280 Gallons of MC70 (5% Mix)
Approximately 886 tons of crushed and screened gravel passing on 3/4 inch square opening screen.
Approximately 1684 Gallons of MC70 Liquid Asphalt Prime to be applied at the rate of 0.3 Gal. per square yard as penetration prior to the application of the gravel material.
Contractor will be required to furnish and apply all materials and to do all the work necessary for full completion of the job.
All Bituminous material shall comply with the specifications as set forth in the General Specifications of the State of Minnesota, Department of Highways.
The successful bidder shall furnish a Surety Bond for the full amount of the contract on or before the 16th day of April, 1969.
All bids must be arrived at independently, they must be accompanied by an affidavit of non-collusion. Any bids not accompanied by such an affidavit will be rejected.

ORDINANCE NO. 23

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE LOCATIONS OF SEPTIC TANKS, CESSPOOLS, DRAINFIELDS AND OUTHOUSES WITHIN PROPERTY LINES, AND THE INSTALLATION, CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, EXTENSION, REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE OF INDIVIDUAL SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS, OUTDOOR PRIVIES OR OUTHOUSES, REQUIRING PERMITS FOR THE INSTALLATIONS THEREOF, PROVIDING FOR INSPECTION, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES.

The Village of Crosslake ordains:
Sec. 1. Sewage Systems: No new septic tank, cesspool, drainfield or privy shall be located within 20 feet of any lot line or right of way on existing lots within the Village, or within 25 feet of any lot line or public right of way on any future platted lots within the Village.

Sub. 1. No new septic tank, cesspool, drainfield or privy shall be located within 50 feet of any lake, river or stream within the Village.

Sub. 2. All state regulations relating to plumbing of Commercial property are hereby adopted and made a part of this ordinance.

Sec. 2. No person, firm or corporation shall install, alter, repair, or extend an individual sewage disposal system in the Village without first obtaining a permit therefor from the Council for the specific installation, alteration, repair or extension. At the time of applying for said permit, the applicant shall pay a fee therefor of \$5.00. Such permits shall be valid for a period of six months from date of issue.

Sec. 3. Applications for permits shall be made in writing upon printed blanks or forms furnished by the Village and shall be signed by the applicant.

Sec. 4. Each application for a permit shall have thereon the correct legal description of the property on which the proposed installation, alteration, repair, or extension is to take place, and each application for a permit shall be accompanied by a plot plan or the land showing the location of any proposed or existing building located on the property and complete plans of the proposed system with substantiating data, if necessary, attesting to the compliance with the minimum standards of this ordinance. A complete plan shall include the location, size and design of all parts of the system to be installed,

altered, repaired or extended. The application shall also show the present or proposed location of water supply facilities and water supply pipe, and the name of the person, firm or corporation who is to install the system, and shall further provide such information as shall be required by the Council.

Sec. 5. The Council shall assign responsibility for administration of this ordinance to a qualified inspector.

Sec. 6. The inspector shall enforce the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 7. The inspector shall make such inspection of inspections as are necessary to determine compliance with this ordinance. No part of the system shall be covered until it has been inspected and accepted by the inspector. It shall be the responsibility of the applicant for the permit to notify the inspector that the job is ready for inspection or re-inspection, and it shall be the duty of the inspector to make the indicated inspection within 48 hours after such notice has been given. It shall be the duty of the owner or occupant of the property to give the inspector free access to the property at reasonable times for the purpose of making such inspections. Upon satisfactory completion and final inspection of the system the inspector shall issue the applicant a certificate of approval. If upon inspection the inspector discovers that any part of the system is not constructed in accordance with the minimum standards provided in the ordinance, he shall give the applicant written notification describing the defects. The applicant shall pay an additional fee of \$5.00 for each re-inspection that is necessary. The applicant shall be responsible for the correction or elimination of all defects, and no system shall be placed or replaced in service until all defects have been corrected or eliminated.

Sec. 10. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in an amount not to exceed \$100.00 or imprisoned for a period not to exceed 90 days. Each day that any violation is continued shall constitute a separate offense.

ORDINANCE NO. 24

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDING WITHIN LOT LINES.

Sec. 1. No new building shall be erected or located within four (4) feet of any property line or public right of way.

Sec. 2. The four (4) foot provision can be waived only by Council action for Commercial property.
