THE NLC held their ground breaking event on June 20th with officials giving a warm hearted thank you to all the contributors and game players who have been instrumental in the realization of the future for the National Loon Center. The campus will be a three-story building, with one story for each phase of a loon's life: in the air, nesting and in the water. The campus will be on a 10-acre plot on the corner of Swann Drive and Pioneer Drive. The project will cost nearly \$20 million, and most of those funds are acquired through private donations and also from State Bond/Grant Funds.

YODELS FROM WITHIN:

2025 Street Repair: Year 2 of the 5 year plan is well under way! with all of the sealcoating and overlay completed, mailboxes are put in and currently Harbor lane is scheduled for starting on July 7th.

Minnesota Cannabis Law: We are the 23rd state in the nation to legalize cannabis but with that comes laws, ordinances and social concerns. Minnesota Statute 342 covers everything from a seed to edibles and beverages to hours of operation. Each city or county within the state can establish limitation on number of facilities or growing operations that will be allowed. The City of Crosslake Ordinance allows for one retail store and no growing facilities. MN Roots will continue its operations and provide retail.

Message from Fire Chief, Chip Lohmiller: 2025 has been very busy for the Fire Dept, with crews responding to nearly 250 calls for service at mid-year. Our team remains committed to providing fast, professional service to the residents and visitors of Crosslake.

In May, the 2nd annual Women's Expo was held. This event was well-attended & received positive feedback from all participants. Also held was the 2nd annual Community Wildfire Prevention Open House on June 28th. This event brought together residents, local agencies, & fire service professionals to share information on wildfire preparedness, defensible space, & safe burning practices. Wildfire awareness remains a top priority for our department.

We're excited to share that two potential firefighter candidates are currently moving through the hiring process. If hired, this would increase our roster to 26 dedicated members. In addition to emergency response, our firefighters continue to participate in ongoing training in both EMS & fire operations to ensure we remain ready to respond effectively & safely in any situation.

Coming up on Aug 5th is National Night Out at 6p.m.—come tour the station, see the trucks, enjoy family-friendly activities and learn about fire safety! Also on Aug. 9th, we invite everyone to join us for our Annual Pig Roast Open House. This family-friendly event is a great opportunity to meet our firefighters, tour the station, explore the trucks and enjoy a delicious meal—while supporting your local fire department! We hope to see you there and as always, we thank the Crosslake community for your continued support and engagement. Stay safe!
