

SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF CROSSLAKE
FRIDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2000
1:30 P.M. – CITY HALL

The Council for the City of Crosslake met in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Friday, October 20, 2000. The following Councilmembers were present: Mayor Darrell Swanson, Irene Schultz, Dean Swanson, Richard Upton and Charles Miller. Also present was City Administrator Thomas Swenson, City Attorney Steve Qualley, City Engineer Dave Reese and Deputy Clerk Darlene Roach. Also present in the audience were Sandy Eliason, Jacob Tiggelaar, Carl Taubert and Jacob Larson.

1. Call to Order - Mayor Swanson called the special meeting to order at 1:30 P.M.
2. Approve Amended Resolution Authorizing a Tax Rate Increase for the 2000 Tax Levy Collectible in 2001. As required by State law, a public hearing was held on October 9th regarding the City's 2000 tax levy. At the Regular Council Meeting, the City Council adopted a Resolution authorizing a tax rate increase for the 2000 tax levy collectible in 2001. Incorrect information was provided to the City in the wording of this Resolution by the League of Minnesota Cities, therefore, an amended Resolution requires approval by the City Council which will be forwarded to the County Auditor's Office. MOTION 10S-0S-00 WAS MADE BY DEAN SWANSON AND SECONDED BY CHUCK MILLER APPROVING RESOLUTION 00-50 AUTHORIZING A TAX RATE INCREASE FOR THE 2000 TAX LEVY, COLLECTIBLE IN 2001. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.
3. Bills for Approval – MOTION 10S-02-00 WAS MADE BY CHUCK MILLER AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE THE BILLS FOR PAYMENT AS SUBMITTED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$8,903.10. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.
4. Jon Henke - Crosslake Park Master Plan – The Crosslake Long Range Park Planning Commission has completed their strategic planning sessions to develop an overall master plan for the Park. Park and Recreation Director Jon Henke provided the Council with the minutes of the various meetings that were held along with a copy of the Long Range Plan Summary. Council approval was requested to finalize the Master Plan Document with the assistance of Dennis Palm and Bob Mattson. The cost to finalize the Master Plan Document along with detailed drawings of the plan would cost approximately \$3500. Printing of the document would cost approximately \$500. The 2001 budget currently contains \$1000 for use on the Master Plan. The balance of the cost would be obtained from the 2000 Park and Recreation Capital Outlay Fund. This Master Plan would be a conceptual plan only, however, future park endeavors would be based on the contents of the plan. Councilmembers Swanson and Miller complimented the Committee on doing a good job on developing the plan. It was the consensus of the Council, however, that if a library is eventually located on the Park property, it would fall under the auspices of the Park and Recreation Department. MOTION 10S-03-00 WAS MADE BY IRENE SCHULTZ AND SECONDED BY RICHARD UPTON TO ACCEPT THE MASTER PLAN SUMMARY AND ITS COMMENTS AS PRESENTED. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

MOTION 10S-04-00 WAS MADE BY IRENE SHULTZ AND SECONDED BY RICHARD UPTON TO CONTRACT WITH BOB MATTSON AND DENNIS PALM TO FORMULATE THE FINALIZED MASTER PLAN FOR THE PARK AT A COST NOT TO EXCEED \$4000. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

5. Paul Larson – Wilderness Park On Site Inspections – Community Development Director Paul Larson reported that the on-site sewer inspection program for the Whitefish Chain is almost complete. One remaining property, Wilderness Park, needs to be inspected. On-site sewage treatment at Wilderness Park is accomplished through a large shared system, similar to a municipal sewer distribution system with seepage drainfields rather than a treatment plan. The system services 141 mobile home units and approximately 5 cabins. Since the City does not have on-site sewage treatment system inspectors on staff, approval was requested to hire Ron Hedlund, who is a local inspector and designer with a strong background in large on-site sewage treatment systems to conduct the inspections. The cost for this inspection would not exceed \$800. The Planning and Zoning budget for 2000 does provide for a part-time on-site sewer inspector to work on the inspection program. Adequate funds remain in the budget to pay for the septic inspection at Wilderness Park. MOTION 10S-05-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY DEAN SWANSON TO AUTHORIZE THE HIRING OF RON HEDLUND TO WORK WITH CITY STAFF TO INSPECT THE LARGE ON-SITE CLUSTER SYSTEM AT WILDERNESS PARK AT A COST NOT TO EXCEED \$800. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Review Proposed Fee Structure for City mapping – A request for City digital mapping information was received from an individual. Widseth Smith Nolting is the holder of this information, however, the City is the owner of the digital mapping information. The Planning and Zoning Staff has developed a form and fee schedule for providing this information to the public. It is recommended that the minimum charge for purchasing digital mapping is \$100 plus consulting fees. This fee would include mapping for an area of up to 5 acres. Areas larger than 5 acres would cost an additional \$20 per acre or part thereof. MOTION 10S-06-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY DEAN SWANSON TO APPROVE THE DIGITAL MAPPING AGREEMENT AND FEE SCHEDULE AS PRESENTED. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Schedule Public Hearing for Appeal – A metes and bounds subdivision request, which was denied by the Planning and Zoning Commission, has been appealed to the City Council. Community Development Director Paul Larson stated that he has scheduled a meeting for November 8th with Tom Lutkin and Ron Morreim of the DNR to discuss the City Ordinance as it pertains to floodplain concerns. City Ordinance clearly indicates denial of this metes and bounds subdivision, so the purpose of the meeting is to determine if City Ordinance is obsolete in regards to this issue. A public hearing was set for Monday, November 13th at 6:00 P.M. at City Hall.

6. Bob Hartman – Request to place order for 2001 squad car – Chief Bob Hartman requested Council approval to place the 2001 squad car on order to ensure delivery in early January. Houston Ford in Pine River will honor the State bid price for a 2001 Ford Crown Victoria. The cost for this vehicle is \$21,419. MOTION 10S-07-00 WAS MADE BY CHUCK MILLER AND SECONDED BY DEAN SWANSON TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF A 2001 FORD CROWN VICTORIA FROM HOUSTON FORD AT A COST NOT TO EXCEED \$21,419. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.
7. Realignment of Pioneer Drive – The Public Works Commission recommended that Anderson Brothers be authorized to complete the realignment of Pioneer Drive with Swann Drive. This realignment was originally going to be completed by the Public Works Department, however, lack of personnel in the department has prevented the work from being completed. WSN has submitted calculated quantities and estimated costs for completion of this work by Anderson Brothers. City Engineer Dave Reese commented that utility work needs to be done in this area and inquired whether the Council wished to proceed at this time. WSN estimated the cost of this realignment at \$14,310. This amount includes clearing, grubbing, excavation, topsoil, Class 5, seed, mulch and fertilizer. Discussion ensued regarding the length of road the City agreed to realign. It was determined that only that portion of road from the end of the blacktop on Pioneer Drive to the current East/West gravel road which runs adjacent to Pine Peaks would be done by the City. This encompasses approximately 100' in length and approximately 20' in width. Councilmember Swanson stated that the City has agreed to realign the road since Bill Reed has a significant investment in Pioneer Road. It was also agreed that the Public Works Department would do the realignment since it does not require a significant amount of work. Public Works Director Ted Strand stated that his department would do the work provided the area is staked. City Engineer Dave Reese stated that the staking would be done on Monday or Tuesday of next week.
8. Reduction of Retainage for 2000 Road Projects – The Public Works Commission is recommending that all but \$5000 in retainage be paid to Anderson Brothers. MOTION 10S-08-00 WAS MADE BY CHUCK MILLER AND SECONDED BY DEAN SWANSON TO REDUCE THE RETAINAGE TO \$5000 FOR THE 2000 ROAD PROJECTS. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.
9. Review need/authorize construction of secured/fenced area for storage – The Public Works Commission reviewed the need for a secured fenced area on the 14 acre site which will be the site of the Public Works facility. This fenced area will be utilized by the City and Crosslake Communications. Police Chief Bob Hartman supports this recommendation since the Police Department has several items that need to be kept in a secured area. These items would include forfeited vehicles obtained by the Department. General Manager Kevin Larson also expressed a need for additional space to store buried copper, coaxial and fiber cable. If constructed, Crosslake Communications would pay one-half of the estimated cost of \$15,000 for a 40,000 square foot fenced area. The Master Plan for the 14 acres was reviewed by WSN to ensure that the fenced area does not get in the way of the proposed sewer plant.

Public Works Director Ted Strand felt the West property line would be desirable since it would be away from the proposed sewer plant. Councilmember Swanson recommended that the fenced area be installed so that a buffer zone could be maintained along the property line. Councilmember Upton recommended a minimum of 20' for the buffer zone. Two quotes for fencing have been obtained. MOTION 10S-09-00 WAS MADE BY CHUCK MILLER AND SECONDED BY RICHARD UPTON TO APPROVE FENCING AT THE LOCATION OF THE PROPOSED PUBLIC WORKS FACILITY AT A COST NOT TO EXCEED \$15,000. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES. The \$15,000 would include Class 5 for the fenced area.

It was noted that Councilmember Miller left the meeting at 2:20 P.M.

10. Approval of 2000 Road Project Resolutions – City Administrator Swenson requested that City Attorney Steve Qualley explain the requirement for a 4/5th vote since Councilmember Miller has left the meeting. City Attorney Steve Qualley stated that if five members of the Council were present, four ayes were required to pass the motion. If four members were present at the meeting, four votes would be required to pass a motion requiring 4/5ths vote. If three members were present at the meeting where a 4/5ths vote was required, three ayes would be required to pass a motion.

City Administrator Swenson read in its entirety the first resolution under consideration for approval by the City Council. The Resolution includes the location of the road, the total cost of the improvement including the contract price paid to Anderson Brothers, engineering fees, administrative fees, cost of publishing and any other expenses related to the project. The resolution also shows what portion of the cost of the improvement would be paid by the City and what portion of the cost would be paid by the property owners through assessment. Assessments will extend over a ten-year period at an interest rate of 6.5 percent per annum from the date of adoption of the assessment resolution.

Kimberly Road – MOTION 10S-10-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-51 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR KIMBERLY ROAD. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement of this road was \$101,250 and the actual cost was \$63,346.99. City Engineer Dave Reese stated that the projects came in under the costs proposed in the feasibility studies since they included an anticipated increase in oil based materials, a 10% contingency amount, and additional costs for construction observation. The contractor receiving the bid did not require the intense oversight by WSN that the prior year project required. He also stated that the City obtained very competitive bids. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Waterwood Court – MOTION 10S-11-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-52 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF

REPORT FOR WATERWOOD COURT. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement of this road was \$35,000 and the actual cost was \$21,642.02. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Velvet Lane – MOTION 10S-12-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-53 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR VELVET LANE. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement of this road was \$24,640 and the actual cost was \$12,608.48. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Rabbit Lane – MOTION 10S-13-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-54 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR RABBIT LANE. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement of this road was \$15,980 and the actual cost was \$10,570.74. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Pine Bay Road/Wolf Trail – MOTION 10S-14-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-55 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR PINE BAY ROAD AND WOLF TRAIL. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement of this road was \$96,370 and the actual cost was \$55,911.57. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Miller Road, Log Landing, Headquarters Drive, Lumberjack Lane, Bunkhouse Road, Tall Timber Trail and Blacksmith Place – MOTION 10S-15-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-56 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR MILLER ROAD, LOG LANDING, HEADQUARTERS DRIVE, LUMBERJACK LANE, BUNKHOUSE ROAD, TALL TIMBER TRAIL AND BLACKSMITH PLACE. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement of these roads was \$280,320 and the actual cost was \$212,869.97. Since the City did not get the easement for the connector road, the City is paying \$108,006.85 versus the assessed amount of \$104,863.12. Some of the legal expenses and the widening of Miller Road to 24' versus 20' were paid by the City. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Pine Bay Trail/Shores Drive – MOTION 10S-16-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-57 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR PINE BAY TRAIL AND SHORES DRIVE. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement of these roads was \$90,050 and the actual cost was \$55,399.81. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Deer Ridge Drive – MOTION 10S-17-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-58 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR DEER RIDGE DRIVE. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement of this road was \$40,000 and the actual cost was \$26,909.63. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Daggett Lane – MOTION 10S-18-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-59 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR DAGGETT LANE. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement for this road was \$27,950 and the actual cost was \$12,518.12. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Backdahl Road – MOTION 10S-19-00 WAS MADE BY RICHARD UPTON AND SECONDED BY IRENE SCHULTZ TO APPROVE RESOLUTION 00-60 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED AND ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT FOR BACKDAHL ROAD. It was noted that the estimated cost for improvement for this road was \$71,875 and the actual cost was \$40,623.85. This decrease was attributed in part to not obtaining the easement for the connector road. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

City Administrator Swenson stated that he has contacted Bond Counsel regarding the \$155,000 remaining in debt service from last years road projects and was informed that these monies can be used to pay for the 2000 road projects. An additional \$100,000 in prepaids from the 1999 road projects is also available for use. Based on this, it was agreed to by Ehlers & Associates that the City did not have to bond for money for the 2000 road projects until next year. At that time it will also be determined if the joint Public Works facility will be included in the bonding.

11. Approval of Resolutions for Hearings on Proposed Assessments - The Council set the times and dates for hearings on the 2000 road projects. It was noted that 14 days published notice and 14 days mailed notice is required under Statute. In addition, all assessments must be certified to the County Auditor by November 30th.
