MOTION that a license be issued to the Pizza House, R. W. Plum, for an "On-Sale" Non-intoxicating Malt. Motion by Delmonico and seconded by Andolshek. The motion carried and vote was unanimous.

MOTION that a license be issued to The Marksman, Mark Hoffman to sell cigarettes. Motion by Andolshek and seconded by Anderson. The motion carried and the vote was unanimous.

Arends mentioned that there has been some illegal traffic on the bike path such as the three-wheelers and horses. Don Coulter, police sargeant, suggested that perhaps an article in the Echo might help.

MOTION by Anderson and seconded by Andolshek that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried and the meeting was adjourned.
