Sept. 1<sup>st</sup>, 1921,

This meeting was called by Chairman Bailey to determine what action should be taken in regard to the Newman road. This road, as laid out, runs across Mr. Newman's land in a quastering course so that it leaves a three-cornered tract of land that could not be used and Mr. Newman proposed to cut out a new road that would run due west on sec. line till near the bank of Phelps lake and then due north to connect with laid out road in front of his (Newman's) house; said new road to be made passable before old road was closed. Now, Mr. Newman has closed the old road and says that the new one is passable, but complaint has been made to the town that said road is not passable. Mr. Bailey and Mr. W<sup>m</sup> Buckite were present at the meeting and they and myself drove over this new road. We found it passable, altho very rough, and the two members of the board present are not willing to accept the road until some more work has been done on it by Mr. Newman. This fact will be made known to him to-day. After auditing some bills and ordering a new W<sup>m</sup> Manuel, and deciding to do some work on the roads this fall, the meeting adjourned. Emil Pettie now was notified to remove buildings and fences belonging to him, which stand in the right of way of new road laid out past his home.

Nov. 3, 1921

This meeting called by M. Bailey, Chairman. To decide what action to take on the claim of Dr. Badeaux in the Dick small boy case. M. Bailey, G. Seckel and H. L. Allen present. W. B. Buchite, absent.

Dr. Badeaux's claim was cut down from \$143.00 to \$60.00 and that amount allowed.

Claims for road work done on the Seafield and Newman roads were presented by overseer of roads Harry Gould; all of said claims being allowed.

It was proposed by Mr Bailey and Mr Seckel to do some more work on the road from Groves place to the Swartout-bridge. The clerk objected to this work on the grounds that the town is in debt enough now (about \$500.00) but, of course, the objection was overruled. The clerk takes orders, he don't give 'em. Mr. Aug. Noren presented a claim for \$140 for work done on Seafield road, since in April, but as there was no money voted for this road this year, and as Mr. Noren agreed when he took the job that he would receive no pay till next year, his bill was vetoed.

The meeting was adjourned with all hands in good humor
