The Meeting was called to order by the Chairman. There was discussion about taking on new subscribers on the telephone lines. It was decided to let the subscribers buy their own phones. Phones to be acceptable to the town board.

Patrons in the district served by the 55 line can be connected on the 55 line only and this same to apply to the 54 line.

The maximum load on either line to be Twenty, 20 phones.

No more phone will be installed in either district until there are fifteen 15 applications after the present lines have their maximum. Applicant to buy their phones through the town board and to pay all expense from the nearest trunk lines and to pay all installation charges and service fees.

It was decided to let J. Tank keep the phone installed in his house 10 days after which the phone will be removed. There was an old age pension application presented to the board for action. This application was tabled until a later date.

The board bought 2 cords of dry wood, 256 cubic feet of wood, from Bill Boonell, for Mrs. Allen & Mrs. Quackenbush.

The Board then examined what bills were outstanding and ordered some payed.
