- 2. Wessels opened the workshop; Bill Schiltz took over upon Wessels departure
- 3. Chapter 26 Land Use; Code of Ordinance for the City of Crosslake
  - 3.1 Land Use Ordinance discussion topics:
    - Land Use Table
      - o All the Accessory Structure item lines all CUP where allowed
    - Sign section
      - o Real estate signs
      - Enforcement, whether on personal property, on someone else's property or road ROW
      - o Electronical changing signs (Community Center)
    - 3.2 Accessory structure discussion:
      - Accessory structure wall height diagrams, size, color, permit requirement procedure types (CUP), visual appearance, the added control using a CUP, which districts should use a CUP
      - Gansen handed out exterior accessory structure diagrams, examples of the structure appearance to be utilized in the definition section of the Land Use Ordinance
      - Possibly have a blanketed area that would not need to do a CUP, but the control over them would be lost
      - Conditions cheat sheet to be updated as needed and to be handed out at the appropriate CUP DRT meetings
    - 3.3 Enforcement:
      - Signs how do you collect a fine from someone who does not own property in Crosslake
      - Gansen made a call to the cargo container supplier and explained our ordinance
      - Nevin requested Gansen to contact Alex or an attorney to help put together a warning type of letter of what would happen if you don't follow the ordinance or an approval motion on a CUP made by the commissioners
    - 3.4 The commissioners agreed that Gansen should start the ordinance change procedure
