CITY OF CROSSLAKE PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, JANUARY 3, 2022 4:00 P.M. – CITY HALL

Pursuant to due notice and call the Public Works Commission held its regular monthly meeting on Monday, January 3, 2022 in City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 4:00 P.M. by Chairman Doug Vierzba with the following members present: Doug Vierzba, Tim Berg, Mic Tchida, Gordon Wagner, and Tom Swenson. Also in attendance were City Administrator Mike Lyonais, Council Liaison Dave Nevin, Public Works Director Ted Strand, Park Director TJ Graumann, Council Member Marcia Seibert-Volz, and City Engineer Phil Martin.

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 4:00 P.M. by Doug Vierzba.
- 2. <u>A MOTION WAS MADE BY TOM SWENSON, SECONDED BY TIM BERG TO APPROVE THE DECEMBER 6, 2021 MEETING MINUTES. ALL IN FAVOR.</u>
 - A MOTION WAS MADE BY TOM SWENSON, SECONDED BY TIM BERG TO APPROVE THE OCTOBER 4, 2021 MEETING MINUTES. ALL IN FAVOR.
- 3. A MOTION WAS MADE BY DOUG VIERZBA, SECONDED BY MIC TCHIDA TO APPOINT TOM SWENSON AS CHAIR OF THE COMMISSION. VIERZBA, BERG, TCHIDA AND WAGNER IN FAVOR, SWENSON ABSTAINED.
 - A MOTION WAS MADE BY TOM SWENSON, SECONDED BY TIM BERG TO APPOINT MIC TCHIDA AS VICE CHAIR OF THE COMMISSION, ALL IN FAVOR.
- 4. TJ Graumann discussed educating the departments and the applicants regarding changes to the Right of Way (ROW) vacation process. The application would be taken by the Planning and Zoning Department and then to the Park and Public Works for review. Mr. Graumann talked about the application process and notifying the public of the commission meetings. Tom Swenson stated that the cost to notify the public should come out of the application fee. A completed survey should be required. Marcia Seibert-Volz recommended streamlining the process so that it only goes through Planning and Zoning and then directly to the City Council for a public hearing. Mic Tchida and Tom Swenson disagreed. Tom Swenson recommend that the notices be sent out by the City Clerk, not the City Attorney. Tom Swenson asked that the language be revised and the matter was tabled until the next meeting.
- 5. Phil Martin provided a report negotiating for the perpetual utility easement at the Log Church and Simonson Lumber. Simonson Lumber would like to trade the sewer connect cost for the storm sewer pond. Tom Swenson stated that Simonson Lumber should pay for the connection charge and the City should pay for the storm water pond, each at the cost of \$6,500. Simonson Lumber also requested that they be allowed to have two years to connect because they are planning a reconstruction project. More discussion with the Log Church needs to be done. Bids for the sewer expansion project will be opened on January 27, 2022 at 1:00 P.M.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY TOM SWENSON AND SECONDED BY GORDIE WAGNER TO RECOMMEND THAT THE CITY COUNCIL APPROVE THE AGREEMENT WITH SIMONSON LUMBER FOR THE COST OF THE CONNECTION FEE AND STORM WATER POND AND TO EXTEND CONNECTION PERIOD TO TWO YEARS. ALL IN FAVOR.

- 6. Ted Strand updated the Commission on all the snow we have had, what we are doing to prepare for more, and snow removal on West Shore path. Ted Strand also talked about how Public Works assisted in getting emergency services to their destinations during the big snow events. Ted Strand discussed road repairs and getting public input on the proposed Harbor Lane trail.

CSAH 66 Improvements

Bids were opened on January 27, 2022 at City Hall. The City received 11 bids ranging from a low bid of \$2,088,000 from Casper Construction out of Grand Rapids, MN to a high bid of \$2,549,401. We have worked with Casper Construction in Aitkin on projects and view them as a responsible and capable bidder for the City work. They indicate they are using Anderson Bros for paving and Knife Lake Construction for the concrete work. These have been good subcontractors in the past, so we are pleased they are part of the construction effort. We had some quantity adjustments during the bidding process based on contractor questions, so our engineers estimate changed to \$1,941,916.97. That puts the low bid about 7.5% above our estimate.

We are recommending award of the low bid contingent upon City decision regarding scheduling a Final Assessment Hearing. Our recommendation is to schedule the Final Assessment Hearing as soon as notice timeframes allow and that the City maintain the assessments, assessment period, appraised market value benefit, and system age connection requirement the same as what was presented at the September 2021 Improvement Hearing.

• Action – Consider information and provide input. We are seeking the Public Works Committee support of our recommendation.

Based on action by the City Council at their January 10, 2022 meeting, an agreement to acquire the perpetual utility easement was provided to Simonson Lumber for the stormwater area. We understand from recent contact with a Simonson Lumber representative that they are reviewing the agreement and have no questions at this time.

We initiated further dialogue with the Log Church to discuss the perpetual utility easement the City would like to acquire. We met with representatives of the Log Church on January 19, 2022, but no progress was made. We reiterated with the Log Church representatives that the 429 Process allows for appeal of the assessment once adopted and advised the representatives that they can address the Public Works Committee and the City Council if they so desired. Based on the lack of progress to date and considering that the 2022 construction season will soon be here, I would request that the City engage the City Attorney to begin the legal process to acquire the perpetual utility easement at the Log Church property.

 Action – Consider information and provide input. We are seeking the Public Works Committee support of our recommendation to engage the City Attorney to begin the process to legally acquire the perpetual utility easement at the Log Church Property.

No additional temporary easements have been received. Based on our easement discussions with residents, we understand that some residents are waiting to see if the City proceeds with construction before they act on the City's request.

2022 Street Improvements

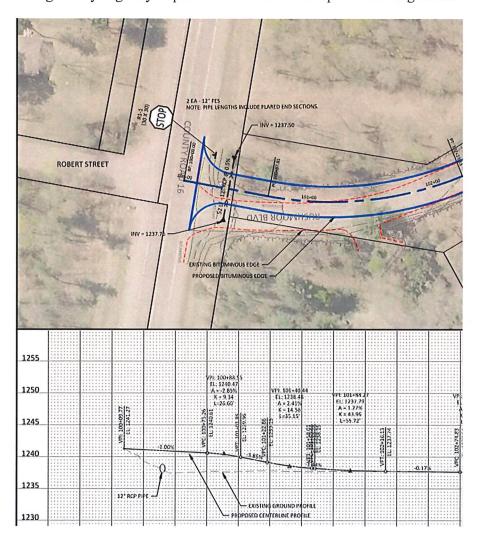
We obtained comments from City staff regarding proposed street improvements and have made those revisions to the plans. Our plan is to wrap up plans based on input we receive from the PW Committee and City Council so that we can begin the public bid process the week of February 21, 2022 and open bids the week beginning March 14, 2022. We are seeking PW Committee support of that proposed bidding schedule.

Action – Consider proposed bidding schedule and provide support to the City Council.

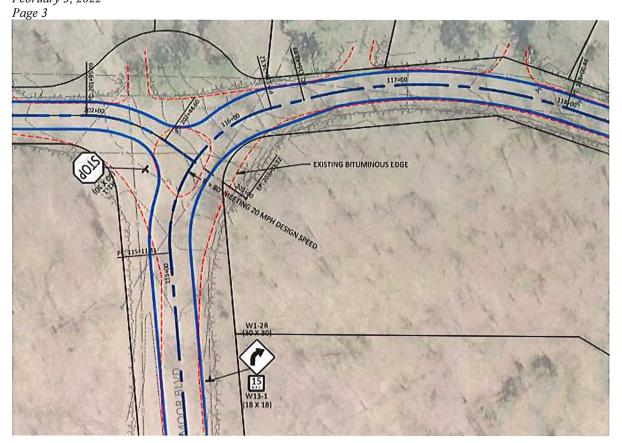
To maintain that schedule, we are seeking input and direction on the following plan items:

Rushmoor Boulevard

1. CSAH 16 Connection – We are proposing to slide the Rushmoor Boulevard centerline to the west within the existing R/W so it lines up with Robert Street and flattening the approach grade. The Crow Wing County Highway Department has reviewed and prefers this alignment.



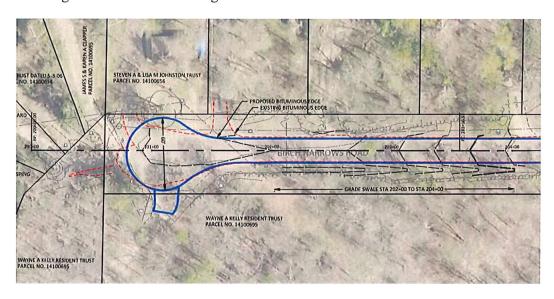
2. Rushmoor Boulevard/Trail Intersection – We are proposing a reduced speed, continuous curve for Rushmoor Boulevard within the existing R/W. Traffic from Rushmoor Trail would be stopped at the intersection with Rushmoor Boulevard.



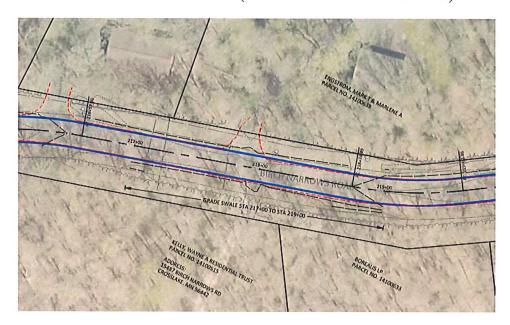
Birch Narrows Road

Based on the soil boring information, a full depth reclamation approach is not recommended for Birch Narrows Road because there is no existing structural aggregate material below the pavement. Instead, we are proposing a reconstruction approach where the existing pavement would be removed and a subcut of material would be completed to provide space to construct the new pavement section without raising the elevation of the street.

1. End of Street Turnaround and Drainage – We are proposing a small circular cul-de-sac and drainage swale within the existing R/W.



2. Added Drainage Swale – We are proposing a shallow swale for drainage located on the non-lake side near the middle of the street corridor (address: 15487 Birch Narrows Road).



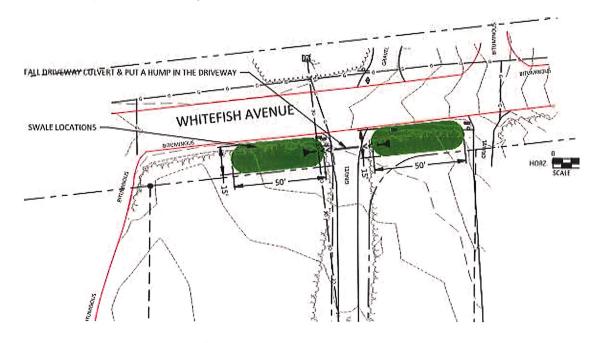
3. Sharp Curve and Drainage – We are proposing to super-elevate (i.e., tip) the sharp curve and add a drainage swale on the inside of the curve. This would require the City to acquire some additional easement.



Whitefish Avenue

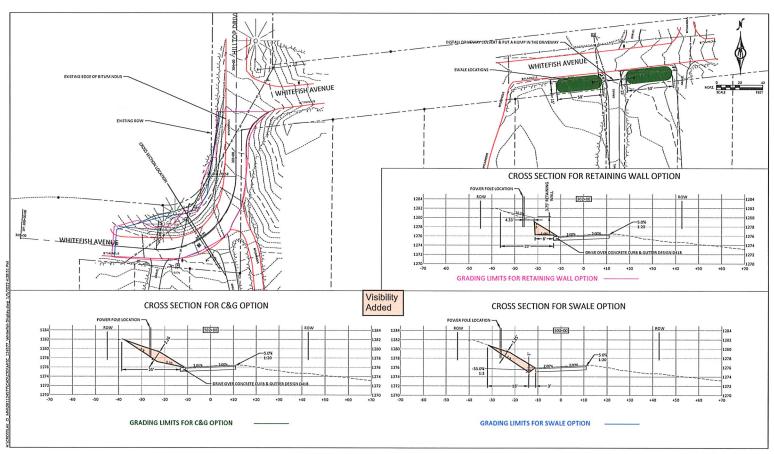
1. Whitefish Avenue Curve - Whitefish Avenue was directed to be completed as an aggregate chip sealcoat project with the Crow Wing County Highway Department. The concerns regarding the curve on Whitefish Avenue south of the intersection of Hilltop Drive and Whitefish Avenue were considered to address the apparent lack of visibility for traffic. We identified 3 options for addressing the visibility concern and have provided budgetary estimates below for consideration and input. The curve options are depicted in the attached exhibit. Is this something the City wants to address or simply leave as is?

- a. Option 1 (Swale) ~\$37,000
- b. Option 2 (Curb & Gutter) ~ \$46,000
- c. Option 3 (Curb & Gutter with Retaining Wall) ~ \$49,000
- 2. Whitefish Avenue Drainage We are proposing to add swales adjacent to the lake access near the Forney property and also to berm the driveway to divert runoff from directly running into the lake. We have identified a few more driveways east of this location along Whitefish Avenue where we may consider berming the driveway to divert runoff onto green areas rather than allowing the runoff directly to the lake.

I'm writing on behalf of the Log Church community to formally express our desire to work with Public Works to arrive at a fairer assessment for the Log Church so that we do not need to protest the currently proposed assessment of close to \$89,000 at a future City Council meeting. We believe our arguments against the currently proposed assessment would have strong public support and we recognize that all we have to do is have two City Council members agree with us and this could shut down or delay this important sewer line project which is not our desire. We support the extension of City Sewer and want to see it happen, yet we simply cannot support the current proposed assessment which would make us, a non-for-profit church, the largest assessment of anyone.

Therefore, we are asking Public Works to consider and recommend to the City Council the following changes/adjustments to the proposed assessments.

- That the Log Church would not be charged any assessment for its parking lot property since it will always be a parking lot, not utilizing the city sewer system in any way
 - The City of Crosslake can be assured it will always remain a parking lot as we have to have that number of parking spaces for the seating capacity of our sanctuary.
- That the Log Church and/or non for profits receive a 50% lower assessment rate than for profit businesses. For-profit businesses like Moonlight and Moonlight Square will benefit and become more valuable when they have city sewer. They can recoup their assessment fees easily by raising their prices or expanding their businesses which they would now have the capacity to do with a city sewer system. A church cannot do that as we do not charge for our programs or services.
- That the Log Church be given time to hook up to the city sewer system as we complied with Public Works to put in a very expensive, 20-25+ year, septic system less than ten years ago. That system is serving us well and will continue to do so for at least ten more years. Since we honored and complied with Public Works to do this, we hope you would honor us in return by allowing us to continue to use the system we have that was put in according to your specifications.

Thank you for your time and for all you do for the City of Crosslake. We hope to hear from someone within a day or two after your meeting.

Based on the City's assessment policy, the City can schedule the Final Assessment Hearing now, prior to actual award of the low bid, or award the low bid and hold the Final Assessment Hearing at a later date. The assessment to property owners is based on an appraised market value benefit and is independent of the actual construction cost. Therefore, it may not make sense to wait to hold the Final Assessment Hearing.

Based on our understanding of the proposed improvements and past input we have received during the improvement hearings, we recommend the City hold the Final Assessment Hearing as soon as notification requirements allow and consider award to the low bidder after the hearing is held.

ROW Vacation Process

City Code, Chapter 42, Article V, Division 2. Vacating Streets

Development Review Team. In order to address environmental and infrastructure concerns, reduce surveying and platting costs, and offer expertise to applicants, developers, and planning officials, the Development Review Team (DRT) shall conduct a pre-project review of all Right-of-Way (ROW) proposals prior to submission of any application.

- a) The DRT shall consist of at least one staff from the following departments (Parks and Rec, Public Works and P&Z).
- b) The DRT shall adopt policies and rules of business governing its timely review and reporting on all ROW Vacation requests.
- c) Meetings will be scheduled and held no more than once a month.
- d) ROW Vacation or Use Agreement DRT application shall be submitted through the P&Z Department and coordinated with Public Works, Parks & Rec, City Clerk and City Attorney.
- e) The Parks and Recreation Director shall be in charge of recording the meetings.

Submission of ROW Vacation Applications

ROW Vacation applications shall be submitted through the P&Z office. Applications will be forwarded to Public Works, Parks, the City Clerk and the City Attorney. Applicant must have a completed survey prior to commission meetings.

Each Department shall be responsible for including the application in their next scheduled Commission meeting. The City Clerk City Attorney shall be responsible for notification to the public of the Commission and Council meeting dates (Either within the 350-ft radius, entire plat or whichever is greater) and the MN DNR (60-day notice). A recommendation from each Commission shall be forwarded to the City Council for their consideration at a regularly scheduled City Council Meeting, but not before the 60-day notice period afforded the MN DNR.

Public Hearing

A public Hearing shall be held according to Chapter 42, Article V, Division 3 of the City Code

In considering a ROW Vacation application, the City Council shall determine and make findings for approval or denial based on the following during the Public Hearing:

- 1. Have a majority of landowners, on a frontage basis, abutting the street, alley, public ground, public way or part thereof, signed on as applicants for this petition?
- 2. Does any part of the ROW terminate at, abut upon, or is adjacent to any public water?
- 3. Has the DNR been notified of the ROW request?
- 4. Are there currently improvements on the ROW?
- 5. Are there currently encroachments from adjacent parcels onto the ROW?
- 6. Is there currently a Use Agreement in place between the neighboring property owners and the City for the encroachments onto the ROW?
- 7. Is the ROW currently being used by the public?
- 8. Based on the topography and shoreline, can the ROW Access be improved for use by the public?
- 9. What are the public benefits of vacating the ROW?
- 10. How will the vacation impact the conservation of natural resources?
